Other data was discovered online in federal and state census records, the Social Security Death Index, and other databases found on familysearch.com and ancestry.com (among other sources).



Preface

The earliest discovered roots of the Hinz family are located in the area known as Pomerania. The name Pomerania comes from the Slavic "po more," which means Land at the Sea. The history of Pomerania, dates back more than 10,000 years. Settlement in the area started about 13,000 years ago, near the end of the Vistula Glacial Stage. Archeological traces have been found of various cultures from the Stone and Bronze Age, of Veneti and Germanic peoples during the Iron Age and, in the Middle Ages, of Slavic tribes and Vikings. Starting in the 10th century, Piast Poland, on several occasions, acquired parts of the region from the southeast, while the Holy Roman Empire and Denmark augmented their territory from the west and north. [1] This area was a province of the Kingdom of Prussia [2] from 1701 until 1819 and the Free State of Prussia [3] from 1819 until 1945. Afterwards the region became part of Allied-occupied Germany and, eventually, present-day Poland.

The earliest known information regarding the Hinz family originates at Wohnort Sagemühl (residence), Gemeinde Poberow (community), Kreis Rummelsburg (county), Pommern, Kingdom of Prussia. This Wohnort is located 4.6 km and 108 degrees from the village of Treblin, which is known today as Trzebielino. [5] Poberow was one of the oldest possessions of the Puttkamer family, who comprised the majority of landowners in the area around Barnow. In the Muster roll taken in 1523, Markus Puttkamer was called in Poberow. The first recorded land owner in Poberow was Mark Puttkamer, whose eldest son Joachim in the Lehnsbrief of 1575 stands alone. A younger son, Markus, died without heirs. [6]

Friedrich Hinz was married to Christine Charlotte Maschke probably between 1830 and 1844. The elder Friedrich was born around 1806. He died in 1879, before his wife and family are listed in the steamship passenger rolls as immigrating to Sauk County, Wisconsin, USA. Charlotte was born on February 23, 1813 in Treten, Rummelsburg, Pomerania. Together, Charlotte and Friedrich raised Friedrich, Wilhelmina, Julius and August Hinz. These are the known members of the family as of this writing. Research is underway to find official church records (KirchenBuchen) from the Pommern region that may give a clearer picture of the makeup of the Hinz family in Poberow. It is believed the family was affiliated with the Lutheran Parish at Zettin (now called Cetyn) which was in a neighboring village to the north of Poberow. [7] The village of Zettin was an old Puttkamer shearing possession. Albert Puttkamer already called it Zettin in the history of the Puttkamer Family in 1380. Zettin was a second center of the Puttkamer possessions and included Zettin, Poberow, Treblin and later shares in the newly established heath villages and outlying estates. [8]

Friedrich Hinz was born around 1806 in Versin, Kreis Rummelsburg, Pomerania (now known as Wierszyno, in Butow County, Poland). He was the son of a day laborer. After marrying Christine Charlotte Maschke he lived in Poberow, Kreis Rummelsburg, Pomerania. He is the father and common ancestor of the Hinz/Hintz families contained on this website. It is believed he was a common laborer within his community in Pomerania. Frederick Hinz died in 1879 with his son Julius reporting the death. He is listed as the father of the groom in the marriage of August G. R. Hinz and Augusta W. Bulow on

March 25, 1899 in Sauk County, Wisconsin. He is also listed as father on Fred A. Hinz's death certificate in 1912 in St. Joseph, Michigan. [9]

Generation (0) – Christine Charlotte Maschke

Christine Charlotte Maschke was born on February 23, 1813 in Treten (now known as Dretyń), Kreis Rummelsburg, Pommern. She was the wife of the elder Friedrich Hinz (patriarch of the Hinz family), as well as the mother of Friedrich August, Wilhelmina, Julius, and August R. Hinz. She is listed in the steamship passenger manifests as having immigrated to Wisconsin with her two youngest sons, Julius and August in 1882. Her name appears third from the bottom of the page that contains the family of Julius Hintz. According to church records, Charlotte died on March 16, 1889 and was buried on March 19. Although no marker has been located, church records indicate she was probably buried in the cemetery at the Zion Lutheran Stone Church in Westfield Township, Sauk County, Wisconsin. Charlotte is listed as the mother of the groom in the marriage of August G. R. Hinz and Augusta W. Bulow on March 25, 1899 in Sauk County, Wisconsin. She is also listed as the mother of Fred A. Hinz on his death certificate in 1912. [10]

Fredrick August Hinz was born on May 25, 1844 to Fred and Charlotte (Maschke) Hinz in the Pommern Province of northeast Germany. That region is now a part of Poland. Fred had a sister, Wilhelmina, and two younger brothers, Julius and August. By the time he was twenty years of age, Fred was serving in the German Army. He served in the regiment with Paul von Hindenburg, who later became a General and was to even later become the first elected President of Germany. Fred was a veteran of three wars, serving in the war with Denmark in 1864, with Austria in 1866 and with France in 1876. At that time Germany was under the reign of King (Emperor) Wilhelm I.

On April 2, 1869, Fred married Miss Wilhelmine C. Burzlaff in Germany. Wilhelmina was the only child of Johann and Henriette Burzlaff. Wilhelmine gave birth to Frank, Herman, Emma, Gustave, and Emil Hinz in Germany. In the fall of 1881 Fred Hinz' family left their home in Poberow, Kreis Rummelsburg, Pommern and immigrated to America. While most immigrants coming in those days were making the voyage on sailing ships, the Hinz family made the trip by steamship. They departed Hamburg, Germany on October 21, 1881 for Hartlepool, a harbor town on the east coast of the British Isles aboard the S/S Kaiser under Captain Bulman. After transferring to Liverpool, on the West coast of England, they boarded the S/S City of Montreal and crossed the Atlantic Ocean. This ship, captained by Francis S. Land, docked in New York City on November 7, 1881.

Along with Fred and Wilhelmine were their four eldest children, Herman, Emma, Emil, and Gustav. Another son named Frank had been born in Germany as well, but died at a young age and was buried in Germany before the family left. Also traveling with the Hinzs were John and Henriette Burzlaff, Wilhelmina's parents, as well as a couple of friends of the family, Charles (age 17) and Bertha Kerlikowske (age 7).

Once in America, they made their way to St. Joseph, Michigan to establish a new home. Fred's sister, Wilhelmina, was married to Edward G. Gast and would also make her home in this area less than a year later. Fred's two brothers, Julius Hinz and August Hinz were to follow at a later date and make their respective homes in the Baraboo, Wisconsin area. Upon arriving in St. Joseph, the Hinzs lived with a family by the name of Rahn. Later they rented a house on Wayne St., living there for about a year. Charles was born in this house. The Hinz family then purchased a house at 800 Court Street and five of the children; Anna, Otto, William, Carrie and Frederick, were born there.

Fred Hinz was a charter member of St. Peter's Evangelical Church in Saint Joseph. Being a carpenter, he helped build the church's first house of worship in 1882. He was an active member of the church for the rest of his life and held the offices of Elder and Trustee for several years. Fred was also a member of the Knights of the Maccabees. The Knights of the Maccabees was a fraternal organization formed in 1878 in London, Ontario, Canada. A related but separate organization, "Maccabees of the World", was also established, the two merging under the title "The Knights of the Maccabees of the World" (KOTMOTW), later shortened to "The Maccabees" in 1914. Most active in the U.S. state of Michigan, the group's fraternal aspects took a backseat to providing low-cost insurance to members. In the society's early years it also provided other final-expense related benefits such as society cemeteries. The Knights of the Maccabees had a membership of 209,831 in 1896.

Gradually failing in health since November 1, Fredrick A. Hinz died at 4:00 Sunday morning on December 1, 1912 in his home on Court Street. He had been suffering with heart trouble for several months. At the time of his death, he was survived by his widow, nine children (Herman, Mrs. Phillip Warman of Coloma, Gustav of Niles, Carrie, Otto, Wilhelm, Frederick, Anna, and Carrie), two brothers, Julius Hinz and August Hinz of North Freedom, Wisconsin, and one sister, Mrs. Wilhelmina (Edward) Gast of St. Joseph, Michigan. Fred was buried in St. Joseph City (Lakeview) Cemetery. [1]

Wilhelmine C. Burtzloff – wife of Friedrich Hinz

Wilhelmenia C. Burtzloff was born to Johann and Henriette (Lohraff) Burtzloff on November 12, 1850 in Germany. Like the Hinz family name, the Burtzloff surname appears to have changed as its families moved from Europe to America. Possible alternate spellings include, Burzloff, Burzlaff, and Burtzlaff. After immigrating to Michigan in 1881, Wilhelmine (also known as "Minnie") was very active within the community. Minnie was a noted charter member of the Zion Evangelical Church when it split from St. Peter's Evangelical Church in 1920 and she helped form the Ladies Aid Society in St. Joseph, Michigan. She lost her mother in 1889 and her father in 1892.

After Fred's death in 1912, Wilhelmine lived in the house on Court Street with her daughter Anna until she died suddenly of a brain hemorrhage on Saturday, March 30, 1930. Funeral services were held on Tuesday at the Court Street home, for family members, and at the church. Friends and relatives at the church service filled the house of worship. The Rev. F. C. Schmidt, Zion church pastor, conducted both rites. Wilhelmine was buried next to her husband, Fred, in St. Joseph City (Lakeview) Cemetery. Her six surviving sons, Herman, Charles, Otto, Will, Fred, and Gustav Hinz, served as casket bearers. [2]

Herman J. Hinz was born to Fred and Minnie Hinz in Germany in 1870. He married Bertha Radewald on 21 July 1891 in Michigan. The 1910 U.S. Census lists his occupation as a "Woodworker in mill." Herman went on to become a vice-president of the St. Joseph



Machine Company for several years and was employed by the firm for a total of twenty-two years. He retired four years before his death. He was also a charter member of the Zion Evangelical Church of St. Joseph, serving on the first building committee in 1920. He held the office of president of the church and also belonged to the church brotherhood. St. Joseph fraternal organizations to which he belonged included the Elks, Masons and Maccabees.

Herman lived for twenty-five years at 113 Wayne Street in St. Joseph, but after the death of his wife, in 1945, he resided with his sister Anna and his brother William in his childhood home at 800 Court Street. Herman died on June 15, 1946 at age 76. After a largely attended funeral, officiated by the Reverend Edwin A. Irion at Zion Evangelical Church, Herman was laid to rest in Riverview Cemetery with his wife, Bertha. [3]

Bertha Radewald - wife of Herman Hinz

Mrs. Bertha (Herman) Hinz was a well-known, lifelong resident of Berrien County. She was born to Fred and Johanna (Pacholke) Radewald on June 9, 1871 in Fairland, a village near Niles, Michigan. The Pacholke surname was also the maiden name of the mother of Johann Burtzloff. After uniting with Herman Hinz, Bertha resided in St. Joseph for her

remaining years in her home at 113 Wayne Street in St. Joseph. She was a charter member of the Zion Evangelical Church and a prominent member of The Ladies Guild of the church.

Bertha passed away around 3:00 p.m. at her home on February 18, 1945. Last rites were conducted on February 21 at the Zion Evangelical Church in St. Joseph and the ceremony was officiated by the Rev. Edwin A. Irion. Casket bearers were; Charles, Otto, William, and Fred Hinz, Otto Gommel, and Edwin Radewald. Bertha was buried in Riverview Cemetery in St. Joseph. Herman and Bertha had no children. [4]

Born on November 27, 1871 in Germany, Emma Hinz was about ten years old when she made the steamship voyage to America with her family. She married Phillip Warman in 1894 in the church her father helped to build. Phillip was a farmer and the two made their home on



his farm in Coloma, Michigan. The couple had two daughters, Lydia and Inger, and two sons, Henry and Herbert. She also helped raise the six children from her husband's previous marriage.

After the death of her husband in 1936, Emma Warman lived with her daughter, Inger Richcreek, and in her childhood home at 800 Court Street in St. Joseph with her sister, Anna. She died on December 15, 1942 at 9:30 p.m. after an illness that lasted four years. She had been confined to bed for the last ten weeks of her life. Funeral services were held at the Kerlikowske Funeral Home with the Rev. Edwin A. Irion from Zion Evangelical Church officiating. Casket bearers were nephews; Rowley, Ernest, Lloyd, Charles, and Gordon Warman, and Herbert Watts. Burial was in Riverview Cemetery. [5]

Phillip Warman – husband of Emma Hinz

Phillip Warman was born in Rochester, New York on March 4, 1854 to Fred and Sophrona (Schraeder) Warman. On March 2, 1878, Phillip married Margaret Kneibus in Bainbridge, Michigan. The 1880 U. S. Census shows Phillip, a farmer, living in Watervliet, Michigan with his wife and their infant daughter, Minnie. In addition to Minnie, Phillip and Margaret would have five sons; Raleigh, Riley, Rob, Roy, and Ernest. Margaret died in 1892 and was buried in the Coloma cemetery.

In 1894, Phillip married Emma Hinz in St. Peter's church in St. Joseph, Michigan. The 1900 Census has Phillip living in Watervliet with his second wife, Emma, the six children

from his first marriage, and his daughter Liddie and son Henry. A son, Herbert, and daughter, Inger, would be born later in 1901 and 1916 respectively.

On Monday, May 25, 1936, Mr. Phillip Warman, 82, prominent lifelong resident of Coloma, died at his home following a short illness. The late Mr. Warman was the victim of a stroke. Apparently in his usual good health, Mr. Warman was up early Monday morning and went to the field to work. He returned about 10 o'clock complaining that he felt ill. He died at 2:30 that afternoon. The late Mr. Warman had resided at the farms where he died for the past sixty years. He was survived by his widow, Emma, four sons, Rolley, Ernest, and Herbert all of Coloma and Henry, a well-known Benton Harbor garage man, two daughters, Mrs. (Lydia) Sykes of Hartford, Michigan, and Miss Inger Warman who was residing at home. Phillip was buried in the Coloma Cemetery with his first wife Margaret. [6]

Born in May of 1895 in Coloma, Michigan, Lydia Warman was the eldest child of Phillip and Emma (Hinz) Warman. She appears in the 1900, 1910, and 1920 censuses living with her parents. In 1930, Lydia was living with her Brother Henry's family. Lydia married Carl Z. Sykes on July 1, 1931. They lived in Hartford, Michigan until Carl's sudden death on New Year's Day in 1939. Lydia then moved back to St. Joseph. In February of 1945 she broke her ankle while walking home from downtown. Lydia married Roy G. Leedy on December 27, 1945 in St. Joseph County, Indiana.

After a year-long battle with cancer, Lydia died on Friday, December 17, 1948. Funeral services were held the following Monday at the Davidson Funeral Home with the Rev. Ralph Everroad of the First Congregational Church officiating. Pallbearers were Hubert Price, Neil James, Otto and Edward Schreiber, Maynard Teed, and Walter Reinhardt. Lydia was buried in Coloma Cemetery. [7]

Carl Z. Sykes – husband of Lydia Warman

Carl Z. Sykes was born in Keeler Township on February 22. 1876, the son of Pliny P. and Elmie Sykes, pioneer residents there. The greater part of his life was spent in Benton Harbor, where in 1904 he was married to Miss Matilda Davies of that city. The death of Matilda Sykes occurred in 1930.

Coming to Coloma from Benton Harbor, Carl Sykes was engaged in the automobile business for about five years, selling the Chrysler and Plymouth cars and International trucks at his West Main Street garage. Prior to engaging in the automobile trade Mr. Sykes had a varied business career. He was associated with several Benton Harbor enterprises, and also traveled for several years as a salesman for the wholesale departments at Marshall Field & Company and Carson Pirie Scott & Co., Chicago, and the Cooper-Wells Knitting

Mills in St. Joseph. During his residence in Benton Harbor Mr. Sykes became a member of the Elks and the Masonic orders, as well as the Shrine.

On July 1 1931, Carl Sykes married Lydia S. Warman. During their residence in Hartford Mr. and Mrs. Sykes gained a wide circle of friends. Carl died on January 1, 1939. Mr. and Mrs. Sykes had entertained at a New Year's Eve dinner party at their apartment on Saturday evening. Their guests departed between 1:30 and 2 o'clock Sunday morning and Mr. and Mrs. Sykes then retired. The hearty repast is thought to have super-induced a fatal heart attack. He died in his sleep without a struggle or uttering a sound. Besides his wife, Lydia, he was survived by two daughters, Mrs. R. Freeman of Milan, Mo., and Mrs. Laverne Spaulding of Benton Harbor, and a brother, Claude Sykes of Benton Harbor. He also left a grandson, Robert Freeman.

Funeral rites were held at the Zuver & Calvin chapel at 3:30 Tuesday afternoon, the Rev. Wm. E. Goltz officiating, and interment was in the family plat in Keeler Cemetery. Casket bearers were M. C. Mortimer, Ralph Hubbard, J. C. Steinhilber, John Coller and Roy Hinckley, of Hartford, and C. M. Slayton of South Haven. [8]

Roy G. Leedy – second husband of Lydia Warman

Roy G. Leedy was born to Ira and Harriet (Ochampaugh) Leedy on October 13, 1890 in Millburg, Michigan. He had two sisters, Laura and Jennie. The Leedys moved from Millburg to Coloma when Roy was two years old. Roy was engaged in farming in his early life. He was drafted into the army on September 17, 1917 and served as a traffic controller in France and Belgium. On 03 May 1922 he married Mildred M. Hanson, but they divorced in 1938. They had no children. Roy married Lydia S. (Warman) Sykes on December 27, 1945 in St. Joseph County, Indiana. Lydia died from cancer less than three years later.

Roy Leedy was a charter and life member of the Coloma American Legion, Post 362, serving as post commander for several years. For over sixty years, Roy was in charge of the flag detail for the post, placing American flags on the graves of veterans at Coloma Cemetery. He was also responsible for placing flags on downtown Coloma streets for Memorial Day observances. As a World War I veteran, Roy was a life member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1137 in Benton Harbor. During the war, he served as a military policeman for the U. S. Army. He was also a member of the North Berrien Historical Society. On August 8, 1987, at the Glad-Peach Festival, the Coloma Fire Department presented the inaugural Senior Citizen Community Award to Roy and to Mrs. Earl (Marian) Smith.

Roy died on Friday, March 24, 1989 at his home in Coloma. At the time of his death, he was ninety-eight and was recognized as the oldest World War I veteran in Coloma. He was also a member of the oldest pioneer family in the area. Funeral services were held at the Davidson Chapel in Coloma on the following Tuesday. Burial was with Lydia in Coloma Cemetery with full military rites conducted by the Coloma American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and the Disabled American Veterans, Chapter 17, both from Benton Harbor. Henry F. Warman was the eldest son of Phillip and Emma (Hinz) Warman. He was born on June 8, 1899. He appears in the 1900 and 1910 censuses living with his parents. Henry was a graduate of Coloma High School and the Detroit School of Automotive Engineering. He entered the U. S. Navy in 1917, serving in both World Wars. On September 19, 1924, Henry married Johanna Kurzer in Chicago, Illinois. They had two daughters, Phyllis and Marsha, and a son, Phillip. While living in Berrien County, he was employed as the Parts Department Manager at Bartz Motor Co. Henry is mentioned as being a well-known garage man in his father's obituary in 1936. He is also listed as being in the U. S. Navy in his mother's obituary in 1942.

Henry died on Monday, May 29, 1961 at the U. S. Naval Hospital in Chicago after a five-day illness. Funeral services were held the following Thursday at the De Vreindt Funeral Home in Chicago. He was buried in St. Boniface Cemetery in Cook County, Illinois on the following Thursday. [10]

Johanna Kurzer - wife of Henry Warman

Johanna Kurzer was born in Illinois on February 14, 1903 to Joseph and Johanna Kurzer. 1920 U. S. Census records indicate she had two brothers and two sisters, and that her parents were born in Germany and immigrated to the United States in the late 1800s. Johanna married Henry F. Warman on September 19, 1924. The 1940 U. S. Census shows Johanna and her three children living in Chicago with her parents while Henry was serving his country in the U. S. Navy. She died on April 26, 1989 and was buried with Henry in St. Boniface Cemetery. [11]

Herbert died in Grace Hospital, Detroit on Friday, July 14, 1967. Funeral services were held at the Davidson Funeral Home in Coloma on Monday, July 17, 1967 with the Rev. H. E. Schuller, pastor of the Faith Lutheran Church of Coloma, officiating. Herbert Sr. was

buried in North Shore Cemetery, Hagar Township, Berrien County, Michigan. Ernest Selmer, Walter Johnson, Paul Hingst, Elmer Aldred, Andrew Sipla and James Richcreek served as pallbearers. [12]

Hilda A. Gemps – wife of Herbert Phillip Warman

Hilda A. Gemps was born to Herman and Annie Gemps in Illinois on November 17, 1902. She married Ralph E. Leist in South Haven, Michigan on September 22, 1923 and they had a daughter, Vera, and a son, Richard. After Hilda's marriage to Ralph ended, she married Herbert Phillip Warman on August 5, 1937 in South Bend, Indiana. In addition to the two children from her previous marriage, Hilda raised a son, Herbert William Warman. Hilda died on November 19, 1996 in South Haven, Michigan the day after her 94th birthday. [13]

Inger A. Warman was born March 7, 1916 in Coloma to Phillip and Emma (Hinz) Warman. She graduated from Coloma High School in 1934 and attended college at Western Michigan University. On October 15, 1939 she married LaCurtis Richcreek and they had a son. Inger was employed as a receptionist by Dr. Edwin R. Irgens in the Fidelity Building in Benton Harbor from 1964 until she retired. She became a member of the Berrien County Medical Assistants Society in 1959, holding the office of Treasurer in 1971. Inger was also awarded the Medical Assistant of the Year Award by the society in 1971. After retirement, she volunteered for many years at Mercy Hospital. Inger was a people person. She enjoyed the time spent with her family, neighbors, and friends. She served as the family historian and genealogist, and always enjoyed a discussion about politics.

Inger Richcreek, passed away on Thursday, May 5, 2011 at Lakeland Regional Medical Center, St. Joseph. She was buried with her husband in Riverview Cemetery. [14]

Lacurtis Richcreek – husband of Inger Warman

Lacurtis C. Richcreek was born on March 10, 1917 in Decatur, Michigan to Edward and Elizabeth Richcreek. He married Inger Warman on October 15, 1939. Lacurtis enlisted in the U. S. Army on March 10, 1943 in Kalamazoo, Michigan and later served in the Iwo Jima campaign. In 1980, LaCurtis retired as a foreman for the United Die Cast Company of Benton Harbor. He died on Thursday, July 21, 1988. Funeral services for LaCurtis were held on the following Saturday at Kerley & Starks Funeral Home in St. Joseph. He was buried in Riverview Cemetery. [15]

Gustave August Hinz was one of eleven children born to Fred and Wilhelmine Hinz. Born on December 17, 1877 in Germany, Gustave was four years old when the family crossed the Atlantic Ocean. Gustave was nineteen years old and still living at home when his brother Emil drowned in 1896. In early 1903 he contracted a severe case of typhoid fever, but he managed to survive the illness. He married Amelia Augusta Schadler in St. Joseph, Michigan on December 5, 1903. They lived in St. Joseph until about 1912 and had four of their five children there. Gustave's family was living in Niles, Michigan when his father died. They moved to Mishawaka, Indiana around 1913.

Gustave and Amelia raised six children while living in Mishawaka; Herbert, Kenneth, Grace, Mildred, Milton, and Florence. Their children were all born in St. Joseph, Michigan except their youngest daughter Florence, who was born in Mishawaka. It was in Mishawaka that this branch of the Hinz name was changed to Hintz. The popular family account of the change in spelling is that when Gustave's children began school they were asked their names and a phonetic attempt was made to spell the family name, thus introducing the 't' into 'Hinz' because of the hard German "z" at the end.

According to his marriage license, at the time of his wedding, Gustave worked for the railroad. For the last twenty-four years of his life, he worked as a laborer at the Dodge Manufacturing Corporation in Mishawaka. An undisclosed illness, lasting eight days, took his life at age 59 in 1937. He was buried in Fairview Cemetery in Mishawaka, Indiana. [17]

Amelia A. Schadler Hintz – wife of Gustav Hinz

Ludmila (Amelia) Augusta Schaedler was born on December 14, 1877 to Gottlieb and Wilhelmine (Thielmann) Schaedler in Olganowka, Volhynia. She was baptized in Olganowka on December 26, 1877. This area is now in the northwest corner of the Ukraine. Amelia's mother died when she was four years old. Her father, Gottlieb, remarried less than two years later to Wilhelmine Gersonde in Volhynia.

The Schaedler family left Bremen on July 13, 1893 aboard the S.S. Stuttgart. Their itinerary took them to the United States via the Port of Baltimore, where they landed on July 28, 1893. The Stuttgart's passenger list indicates that Gottlieb's destination was his brother-in-law's residence in Saint Joseph, Michigan. Amelia immigrated to the United States with her father, step-mother, two brothers, and several step-brothers and step-sisters. In transit, the family name was changed to Schadler. She married Gustav Hinz in 1903 and they raised six children. Amelia also assisted in raising four of her grandchildren when the wife of her son Kenneth died at an early age. Amelia died in Mishawaka on December 9, 1954 and was buried with Gustav and her youngest son Milton in Fairview Cemetery. [18]

Census lists Herbert and Wilma living in Mishawaka with newborn daughter Carol Jean. Herbert was a professional golfer, and was an instructor at the Eberhart-Petro municipal golf course in Mishawaka. He played in the Mishawaka City Golf Championship at least once. Herbert died on June 28, 1973 in the Stephens Nursing Home in Niles, Michigan. He was buried with his wife in Fairview Cemetery in Mishawaka. [19]

Wilma Georgianna Shamo – wife of Herbert Hintz

Wilma Georgianna Shamo was born on September 29, 1906 in Indiana. After marrying Herbert Hintz in 1924, she had a daughter, Carole Jean, who was born in 1940. Wilma worked forty-seven years at the Uniroyal, Inc. facility in Mishawaka, retiring in 1969. She lived in Mishawaka and South Bend, Indiana with Herbert until her death on July 27, 1971. They are buried together in Fairview Cemetery in Mishawaka, Indiana. [20]

Kenneth Carl Hintz was born on July 31, 1905 in St. Joseph, Michigan. After the family moved to Mishawaka, Indiana (around 1912) he left school in the eighth grade (~1919) to help at home with expenses. Those growing up years were not easy but he did the right things that fit the times. In 1928 he married Florine Marie Accoe. Living in Mishawaka, Indiana they were blessed with six children. But life was not to be easy. Between the years of 1935 and 1941 Kenneth buried his father, a brother, and two daughters, along with saying good-by to his wife of thirteen years. As a young man of thirty-seven years he was now left to raise his three boys and daughter ranging in ages eleven, ten, four, and one year – eight months.

After receiving offers, from many relatives, to take certain ones of the four children into their homes, Kenneth decided that although they were a fractured family, they were still a family. They were to stay together. After a short time Kenneth's mother (Amelia Schadler Hinz) came to take care of the family, because she knew her son "needed" her. This was not an easy decision for a widow aged 60 to make; especially after raising six children of her own.

Kenneth worked for, and retired from, the Studebaker Corporation in South Bend, Indiana. He died on February 17, 1989 and was buried with his family in St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery in Mishawaka following funeral services held at St. Joseph's Catholic Church. [21]

Florine Marie Accoe – wife of Kenneth Carl Hintz

Florine Marie Accoe was born on February 23, 1905 in Mishawaka, Indiana to Serafien and Marie (Bracke) Accoe. Her family had immigrated to the United States from Eeklo, Belgium only about one year before her birth. On August 28, 1928 she married Kenneth Carl Hintz at St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, in Terre Coupe, Indiana. They would have six children but two would not survive beyond a very early age.



Florine died abruptly on August 26, 1941 after a short illness, leaving a family of four small children. After funeral services at St. Joseph's Catholic Church she was buried in St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery in Mishawaka with her deceased daughters, Shirley and Joanne. [22]

Anna Wolowicz Hay - second wife of Kenneth Carl Hintz

Anna Wolowicz Hay was the second wife of Kenneth Hintz. She was born in Warren, Massachusetts on May 24, 1903 to George and Regina Wolowicz, who had emigrated from Austria in the late 1890s. Anna had five brothers and two sisters. She spent most of her life in the Mishawaka, Indiana area. Anna worked for the Studebaker Corporation for several years. She married Kenneth Carl Hintz on November 20, 1956. Anna died in St. Paul's Health Care Center in South Bend, Indiana on Wednesday, June 24, 1987. Following a service at the Hahn De Vos Funeral Home in Mishawaka she was buried in St. Joseph Catholic Cemetery in Mishawaka. [23]

Grace Hintz was born on July 31, 1912 in Saint Joseph, Michigan. She and Theodore Zopf were united in marriage on January 1, 1930. The 1940 U. S. Census lists them living in Mill Creek, La Porte County, Indiana with their one son, Charles Theodore Zopf and Ted's father, Edward. Tragedy struck in 1956 when their only son died after contracting Bulbar Polio. Charles left behind a wife and infant daughter. After Ted died in 1982, Grace spent time with her daughter-in-law and granddaughter in California.

Grace died on September 24, 2002 in the Santa Cruz Health Center, Santa Cruz, California. She was buried with Ted in St. Joseph Valley Memorial Park in Granger, Indiana. [24]

Theodore Zopf – husband of Grace Hintz

Theodore "Ted" Roosevelt Zopf was born on November, 17, 1904 in Axtel, Kansas. Ted was the son of Edward "Pappy" and Edith Zopf of Dixon, Illinois. Ted married Mattie Vera Pittman in Tippecanoe, Indian on October 10, 1925, but the marriage didn't last long. He married Grace Hintz on January 1, 1930 in the parsonage of the First Presbyterian Church in Mishawaka, Indiana by Rev. Burnett. In 1974, he retired as the head maintenance man for New Prairie Schools. Ted was a DeMolay Dad and a member of the Terre Coupe Masonic Lodge. He was also a Worthy Patron of the Order of the Eastern Star of New Carlisle.

Ted died at the Desert Samaritan Hospital on Tuesday, January 12, 1982 while vacationing in Mesa, Arizona. After an Eastern Star service at the Orvis-Palmer Funeral Home on Friday, he was buried in St. Joseph Valley Memorial Park, Granger, Indiana. The Rev. Robert Heckaman, pastor of the Lydick United Methodist Church officiated at the funeral services. [25]

Mildred Hintz was born on May 7, 1907 in Saint Joseph, Michigan. She and Robert Syester were wed on December 16, 1933 in Mishawaka, Indiana. Mildred lived in Niles, Michigan for twenty-seven years. She was a member of the Messiah White Shrine 10 of South Bend and the Order of the Eastern Star in Niles.

Mildred died on May 21, 1998, having moved to Mishawaka to live with her sister Grace just three weeks before her death. After services at the Hollis-Palmer Funeral Home, officiated by the Rev. Dan Crosley, she was buried with Robert in St. Joseph Valley Memorial Park. [26]

Robert L. Syester – husband of Mildred E. Hintz

Robert Lawry Syester was born on January 28, 1897 in Terre Haute, Vigo County, Indiana to Hewell and Hester Syester. He is listed with his parents and a sister, Lola, and brother, Ira, in the 1900 U. S. Census. Robert's life, however, was not easy. Robert's mother died in May of 1903, and his father in March of 1904. Other records place him at the Clay County, Knightsville Orphanage in 1904 and at the Rose Orphan's Home in Terre Haute in the 1900's. The 1910 U.S. Census finds Robert living at the home of his aunt, Hulda Sigler. His sister, Lola, married Harry Crago in 1909, but no other records of his brother Ira have been located.

On November 27, 1919, Robert married Lucinda Derf in Mishawaka, Indiana. They appear in the 1920 U. S. Census living with her parents, Robert and Flora Derf. The 1930 U. S. Census lists Robert L. Syester as a roomer within a household in Peoria, Illinois, possibly working while away from the family as the depression took hold. Lucinda died in 1932 and was buried in Fairview Cemetery in Servia, Wabash County, Indiana. Robert then married Mildred Hintz on December 16, 1933. The couple appears in the 1940 U.S. Census in Mishawaka, Penn Township, Indiana with four daughters from Robert's marriage to Lucinda. Robert and Mildred later moved to Niles, Michigan. Robert was a member of the Order of the White Shrine of Jerusalem in Niles. He held several offices within the order throughout his later years.

Robert died on October 2, 1975 in Buchanan, Michigan and was buried in St. Joseph Valley Memorial Park, Granger, Indiana. [27]]

Milton A. Hinz, age 28 of 715 Lincoln Way West, former Mishawaka High School football, basketball and track star, died at 9:35 p.m. after an illness of eight months. He was born in Saint Joseph, Michigan and had lived here for the last 23 years, coming here from St. Joseph. Until his illness, he was employed as a machinist by the Dodge Manufacturing Corporation in Mishawaka.



Milton was buried with his parents in Fairview Cemetery in Mishawaka. [28]

Florence M. Hintz was the youngest daughter of Gustave and Amelia. She was born on August 10, 1917 in Mishawaka, Indiana. On August 21, 1942 Florence enlisted in the Women's Army Corps of the U. S. Army in Indianapolis with the rank of Aviation Cadet. She served during World War II as an aerial photograph interpreter. While in the army, Florence met and married Hiram Eugene Stauffer and they had a son and a daughter. She and her husband were stationed in Great Britain when their son Ronald was born.

Florence died on March 2, 2011 in Washougal, Washington and her remains were cremated. Her ashes were buried with Hiram's in the Quarryville Cemetery, in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. [29]

Hiram E. Stauffer – husband of Florence Hintz

Hiram Eugene Stauffer was born on August 8, 1913 in Dumore County, Pennsylvania. He married Florence Hintz. During World War II, Eugene was a Staff Sergeant stationed in Great Britain. He retired as a veteran after thirty years of service in the U. S. Army Air Corps (U. S. Air Force). Hiram died in Las Vegas, Nevada on August 19, 1997. Services were held in Pennsylvania with interment in the Quarryville Cemetery. [30]

1.5 Emil Hinz (Generation 2)

Not much is known about Emil Hinz. He was born shortly before the Hinz family moved to America in 1881. He did not live a long life as he drowned in 1896, at the age of fifteen, in Michigan. Emil was buried in the St. Joseph City Cemetery near his parents and grandparents, John and Henrietta Burtzloff. Unfortunately, the Burtzloff's actual burial location within the cemetery is not fully documented, so Emil's location is also still to be determined. Another mystery persists as to why the Michigan Death Index lists Emil as having drowned in Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, while family accounts have his death in the St. Joseph River near his home. [31]

Charles died on June 1, 1978 and was buried in Riverview Cemetery in Saint Joseph, Michigan. [32]

Carrie Mielke – wife of Charles Hinz

Carrie Mielke was born on October 30, 1882 into the family of Julius Mielke in St. Joseph. She was married to Charles Hinz on November 6, 1912.

Carrie Hinz was 85 when she died in her home on Monday, July 8, 1968 at 9:45 a.m. Besides her husband, Charles, surviving her were: a son, Arthur, of Detroit; two grandchildren and one great-grandchild; two sisters, Mrs. Emma Abbott of Benton Harbor and Mrs. Louise Allain of



Hammond, La. Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. on the following Wednesday in the Kerlikowske funeral home. The Rev. Richard Selmer, pastor of St. Peters United Church of Christ officiated. Burial was in Riverview Cemetery. Casket bearers were Leland and Russell Hendrix, Theodore Schneider and LaCurtis Richcreek. [33]

Arthur Charles Hinz was born on August 28, 1913 in St. Joseph, Michigan. Arthur attended Michigan State University. He met, and later married, Ruth Robinson while there. He later moved to, and lived in, the Detroit, Michigan area. Arthur retired as the Marketing Director from Ross Controls, an international manufacturer of pneumatic valves, controls systems, and safety products for the fluid power industry.

Arthur C. Hinz died on June 9, 2005 and was buried in Riverview Cemetery in St. Joseph, Michigan. [34]

Ruth E. Robinson – wife of Arthur Charles Hinz

Ruth Eleanor Robinson was born on August 1, 1916 in Boston, Massachusetts to George and Eva Robinson. She also had a brother named Richard. Her ancestors arrived from England in the Boston area in the 1600s and she had a grandmother who owned a piano store near Boston.

Ruth attended Simmons College in Boston but transferred to Michigan State University when her family moved to Detroit because of her father



becoming involved with the automobile industry. While Ruth was attending Michigan State she met Arthur Charles Hinz. They were married in 1939, settled in Detroit, and had a son and a daughter. Throughout Ruth's teaching career the Hinz household welcomed various dogs that her students were unable to keep for one reason or another.

Ruth moved from Rochester, Michigan, to Perry Farm Village in 2009 and enjoyed many wonderful friends there. She was the Perry Wii Bowling Queen and played a wicked hand of Euchre. Ruth was able to remain in her condominium until her passing. Ruth died on Friday, February 23, 2018 at the age of 101 years. She is survived by her son and daughter, and a grandson and granddaughter. [35]

Anna H. Hinz was born on April 29, 1884 in Saint Joseph, Michigan. Anna never married. She lived with her mother, Minnie, after her father's death in 1912. In fact, she lived in the house on Court Street her entire life. Anna was a noted member of the Zion Evangelical and Reformed Church in St. Joseph and a charter member of the Ladies Aid Society.

According to several articles in the local newspapers, she was also very active in the community. She often hosted the Post Office Auxiliary at her home. Anna died in November of 1977 in the Park-Way Manor Nursing Home and was buried in Riverview Cemetery. [36]

Otto Herman Hinz was born on August 25, 1886 in Saint Joseph, Michigan. On July 2, 1910 he married Wilhelmina A. Hingst in his home in Saint Joseph. Otto was employed at Cooper, Wells & Company for twenty-five years before starting his own painting and decorating business. In the Polk 1940 City Directory for Benton Harbor/Saint Joseph, Otto was listed as a printer by trade. Otto and Minnie celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary on July 2, 1960 with an open house in their home on Pearl Street in St. Joseph. The party was hosted by their son and daughter.

Otto died on Tuesday, April 27, 1971 in St. Joseph Memorial Hospital. Funeral services were held on Friday in the Kerlikowske and Starks Funeral Home with the Rev. C. W. Runkel officiating. Otto was buried next to his wife in Riverview Cemetery in Saint Joseph. Casket bearers were; Ronald Schroeder, Harry Case, David Froehlich, and Robert, David, and John Hinz. [38]

Wilhelmina A. Hingst was born to Carl and Adeline Hingst in Pommern, Germany on February 25, 1886. She moved with her parents, three brothers, and younger sister to Berrien County in 1893 at the age of seven. She married Otto H. Hinz on July 2, 1910 in St. Joseph, Michigan. Minnie was a charter member of Zion Evangelical and Reformed Church and a member of the Women's Guild of the church.

Mrs. Otto Hinz, of 1119 Pearl Street, St. Joseph died at 11:30 a.m. Monday, December 7, 1964 in Campey's Convalescent Home, St. Joseph. She had been ill the past two years. Surviving her was her husband, Otto; a son, Edward of St. Joseph; a daughter, Mrs. Ervin (Margaret) Schroeder of Sodus; seven grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; a

brother, Carl Hingst of Benton Harbor and a sister Mrs. Arnold (Ida) Schrage of St. Joseph. Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. in the Zion Evangelical Church with the Rev. Edwin A. Irion, pastor officiating. Burial took place in Riverview cemetery with casket bearers; Orville Schrage, Ronald Schroeder, Robert Hinz, David Hinz, and Paul Hingst. [39]

Margaret A. Hinz was born on December 14, 1914 to Otto and Minnie Hinz in St. Joseph. She graduated from St. Joseph High School in 1932. Margaret married Ervin A. Schroeder on June 1, 1935 and they had four children. She was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Sodus, where she sang in the church choir and was active in the Ladies Aid. An open house was help to mark Margret and Ervin's 40th anniversary. Margaret died early Sunday morning on September 29, 2002. Funeral services were held on October

2nd, at St. Paul's with the Reverend Robert Duehlmeyer officiating. Margaret was buried in Mount Pleasant Cemetery with Ervin and her eldest son, Norman, who had died in 1953. [42]

William A. Hinz was born to Fred and Wilhelmina Hinz in St. Joseph, Michigan on December 11, 1887. He was a member of the Zion Evangelical and Reformed Church and the Brotherhood of the Church. On December 12, 1914 he married the former Margaret Mosely Olson Loeffler and they had a son and daughter. She preceded him in death on



July 21, 1927. Ten years later, he married Ethel B. Hollinger. Ethel died on May 13, 1942. William retired after a long and noted career at the St. Joseph Post Office.

William died on Sunday, July 9, 1967 after suffering an apparent heart attack at his home. He was dead on arrival at Memorial hospital. Survivors included a daughter, Mrs. Albert (Margaret) Robandt of Park Ridge, Illinois; a son, Frederick (and Louise) of Seaside, Oregon; three grandchildren; two brothers Charles and Otto of St. Joseph; and a sister, Miss Anna Hinz of St. Joseph. Margaret Olsen – wife of William A. Hinz

Margaret Mosely Olson was born in 1883 in Missouri. As a child, she was adopted by George and Julia Olson. According to the 1900 census, her adoptive father was born in Norway and her adoptive mother was from New York. On November 1, 1900 Margaret married Herman Loeffler. The 1910 census shows them having settled in Niles, Michigan and raising a family of three children; Charles G., Adeline M. and Herman A. Herman Sr., and Margaret divorced within the next couple of years and Margaret married William Hinz

on December 12, 1914. She was the mother of Frederick and Margaret H. Hinz, born in 1916 and 1918 respectively. The 1920 census shows the Loeffler children living with George and Julia Olson, along with William and Margaret and the Hinz children, at the Olson's home in St. Joseph.

Margaret died on July 21, 1927. Margaret's funeral was held on July 23, 1927 and was widely attended. Miss Alice Freund sang "Asleep in Jesus" and Heaven is My Home" at the service. Casket bearers were William Rahn, Homer Banks, E. D. Lloyd, Fred Hinz, Herman Hinz, and Otto Krause. Margaret was buried in the mausoleum in City (Lakeview) Cemetery in St. Joseph, Michigan. [45]

Ethel B. Tompkins Hollinger – second wife of William A. Hinz

Ethel Berdine Tompkins was born in Ohio on December 6, 1898 to Frank and Minnie Tompkins. Ethel married Harry L. Hollinger and they had two sons. Harry Jr. died about a month after his birth while the couple was living in Ohio. In 1930 Harry and Ethel were living in La Porte, Indiana with their second son, Robert. Robert is also listed living with Ethel's parents in Ohio in 1930. After the marriage ended, Ethel wed William Hinz in 1937.

Ethel died suddenly on Wednesday, May 13, 1942 at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Herman Hinz while helping to care for her ailing sister-in-law, Bertha. A large crowd of friends and relatives attended the funeral services for Ethel at Zion Evangelical Church in St. Joseph on Thursday, and she was buried in the City Cemetery in Massillon, Ohio the following day. Her tombstone inscription reads 'Ethel B. Hintz'. Ethel's parents, Frank and Minnie, were buried next to her when they died in 1953 and 1956 respectively.[46]

When Fred's father died in 1967, the obituary listed his residence as Seaside, Oregon. Fred was a member of the Knights of Pythias, a fraternal organization promoting values of overall goodwill towards men. He died on January 18, 1984 in Seaside, Oregon, just four days after the passing of his wife. [47]

Louise Caroline Jarr – wife of Frederick W. Hinz

Louise Caroline Jarr was born on October 3, 1899 in Wilton, Iowa to Louis and Freida F. (Stecher) Jarr. She attended school on Blackfoot, Montana. Louise married Fred W. Hinz in Vancouver, Washington on January 31, 1942. After moving to Seaside, Oregon, she operated a local restaurant for several years and also worked at Phillips Candy

Kitchen. Louise was a member of The Pythian Sisters, serving as Grand Chief of the Temple of Oregon for several years. A memorial service was held for the couple on the Saturday following their deaths at the Hughes-Ransom Mortuary in Seaside. [48]

On Monday, May 13, 1940 Margaret married Albert August Robandt in the Park Congregational Church in Grand Rapids. The ceremony was led by the Rev. Ralph Holmes, a former resident of St. Joseph, Michigan. After living a few years in Grand Rapids, they spent most of their lives, and raised their family; two daughters, Mary and Lucy, and a son, Alan, in the Chicago, Illinois area. Frank C. Bingham was born in Allegan County on March 21, 1890 to Julius and Leah Bingham. He married Jennie R. Weed on July 30, 1910 and they had a son, Lloyd, and a daughter, Neva. Frank married Carrie M. Hinz on December 28, 1919 and later adopted her daughter, Eleanor.

A resident of St. Joseph, Benton Harbor and surrounding community for forty years, Frank C. Bingham died at 12:02 a.m. on October 20, 1952 at Memorial Hospital, St. Joseph where he had been admitted on October 11. Mr. Bingham was 62 years old at the time of his passing. Before his illness he had been employed at the Kaywood Corporation and prior to that he had worked at the Truscott Boat Co. and the Whirlpool Corporation. For several years, he operated an excursion boat on Paw Paw Lake. He was a member of the National Association of Stationary Engineers.

The 1930 U.S. Census lists sixteen-year-old Eleanor Putnam as living with Carrie and Frank Bingham as his step-daughter. At some point after this census, Frank must have adopted Eleanor because Eleanor Ruth Bingham married William Herbert Omweg on October 8, 1932 in La Porte, Indiana. Mr. and Mrs. Omweg lived in Benton Harbor, Michigan and had a daughter, Carol. After William died, Eleanor married Theodore N. Schneider and they continued to live in the St. Joseph area until his death in 1975. Eleanor R. Schneider died at her home in St. Joseph, Michigan on Saturday, June 14, 1986. Funeral services for Eleanor were held on the following Tuesday at Kerley & Starks Funeral Home and she was buried in North Shore Memory Gardens. [53]

William H. Omweg – husband of Eleanor Putnam-Hinz-Bingham

William Herbert Omweg was born in Watervliet, Michigan on October 3, 1913. He married Eleanor Ruth Bingham on October 8, 1932 in La Porte, Indiana. William was a veteran of World War II. The 1940 U. S. Census places him at Fort Clark in Kinney, Texas. After his service, he was employed as a screw machine operator at Benton Harbor Screw Company. William was credited in a June, 1949 newspaper article with saving his young daughter from drowning.

William died in Memorial Hospital on August 19, 1964 after a three-month illness. Funeral services were held at the Kerlikowske, Starks & Beatty Funeral Home on the following Friday. The Rev. E. A. Irion, pastor of the Zion Evangelical and Reformed Church, officiated. William was buried in North Shore Cemetery in Hagar Township, Berrien County, Michigan. [54]

Theodore N. Schneider was born on February 15, 1905. Theodore was employed by, and retired from, the Whirlpool Corporation. Fred William Hinz, 67, a real estate salesman for Moore and Associates, died Saturday, August 27, 1960 at 12:30 p.m. in the Veterans Administration Hospital in Ann Arbor, Michigan. Mr. Hinz, of 800 Court Street, St. Joseph, had been ill about six weeks. A lifelong resident of St. Joseph, he was born on November 1, 1892. He was a member of the St. Joseph Elks Lodge 541. During World War I, he was a corporal with the U. S. Army Engineers in France. The 1940 Polk City Directory for Benton Harbor lists Fred as the manager of the local Pepsi-Cola Distributing Company.

At the time of his death, Fred was survived by his wife, the former Florence Crow. His only son, Fred "Buster" Hinz preceded him in death in 1941. Funeral services were held at the Kerlikowske Funeral Chapel in St. Joseph on Wednesday at 10:30 a. m.. Pall bearers were Al Charleston, Harry T. Crow, P. R. Schilling, Victor Moore, LaCurtis Richcreek, and Edwin Lenenga. Burial was in Riverview Cemetery, St. Joseph. [56]

Florence Crow - wife of Frederick Hinz

Florence Crow was born in 1897 to William and Ella (Gribben) Crow in Benton Harbor, Michigan. She had two older brothers, Vernon and Harry and an older sister, Hazel. Florence graduated from high school in May of 1914. She married Frederick Hinz on June 22, 1918 in Benton Harbor. Fred was a soldier and Florence was a stenographer at the time of their wedding. The 1940 Polk City Directory for Benton Harbor lists Florence as a stenographer for Peoples Savings Association. After the death of her father in 1937, she was named as the administrator of his estate in the probate hearings of September 1944. Florence had a successful business career, later becoming a licensed realtor.

After Fred died in 1960, Florence lived in Sarasota, Florida. She was married to John C. Beard in 1964 in England. John was English born and was the curator of Horne's Cars of Yesterday, an antique car museum near Sarasota, Florida. He was also a talented artist, having studied as a child under Claude Thornhill in England. John particularly liked painting seascapes with oil on canvass. Some of John's paintings were displayed at the St. Joseph Yacht Club, along with several galleries in south Florida throughout various times of his life. John and Florence lived in Sarasota and traveled extensively in Europe until Mr. Beard's death on July 6, 1978 in Sarasota. Florence buried her second husband in his native England. At some point after that, Florence moved back to Southwest Michigan. She died on May 29, 1992 in Bridgman, Michigan. It is believed her remains were cremated and buried in England with her second husband, John. [57]



The 1940 Benton Harbor City Directory lists Fred, Jr. as the warehouse manager for Pepsi-Cola Distributing Company, but he was also a noted musician. Fred was also a member of the Naval Reserve. He died from pneumonia on May 13 1941 at the young age of twenty-two. For his funeral the composition "When the Day is Done" by Fred Hinz, Jr. was played as his family entered the church. Casket bearers were William Billion, Cecil Stearner, Kenneth Ball, Ray Hafer, Ed Hatch, and Harry Rimes, Jr. Burial was in the family plot in Riverview Cemetery, St. Joseph, Michigan. [58]

Fred and Christine Charlotte (Maschke) Hinz's only daughter, Wilhelmina, was born in Germany in 1848. She married Edward C. Gast before the Hinz family moved to America. U.S. Census records from 1900 indicate the family immigrated about 1883, but the death certificate for Edward A. Gast lists his birth in Covert, Michigan on November 4, 1882. At the time of their immigration Edward and Wilhelmina would have been traveling with; Gustav (ten years old), Emma (seven), Martha (two), and Margaret/Grace (one). A passenger list from April 30, 1882 for the S.S. Nurnberg lists an Eduard, Wilhelmine, Christof, Emma, Martha, and Margarethe Gast arriving together in Baltimore from Bremen, Germany. While the ages of the passengers in this list are not all exact matches, this has a high probability of being the same Gast family described on this site. The remaining four sons, Edward, Jr., Albert, Henry, and Frederick, were born in St. Joseph, Michigan.

Wilhelmina Hinz Gast died from cancer in the home of her daughter, Martha Dwan, in

Benton Harbor at 3:30 PM on Thursday, April 28, 1920. Funeral services were held on the following Saturday at the Dwan home. Minnie Gast was laid to rest with her husband Edward in the mausoleum at St. Joseph City (Lakeview) Cemetery. [1]

Edward C. Gast – husband of Wilhelmina Hinz (Generation 1)

Edward Carl Gast was born in Germany on May 7, 1843. He married Wilhelmina Hinz in Germany and they had four children; Gustav, Emma, Martha, and Margaret/Grace. In April of 1882 they immigrated to the United States and settled in Saint Joseph, Michigan where they had four more sons. On October 15, 1888 Edward completed the naturalization process and was officially a U. S. citizen. The 1892 Berrien County Directory lists Edward Gast as a pattern maker for St. Joseph Iron Works. Edward was a charter member of St. Peter's Evangelical Church, helping to organize the congregation and to build the original church building. He was also a charter member of the Knights of the Maccabees in St. Joseph. Edward ran for the office of First Ward City Council Supervisor in 1908, but was defeated by the incumbent, Thomas Walker, by a mere seventeen votes.

On January 21, 1916 Edward was stricken with a stroke of paralysis while resting on a couch in his home in the early evening. Early reports gave hope of a gradual recovery, but his condition did not improve. Edward died at his home on Tuesday, March 28, 1916 at 9:15 AM. He had been in excellent health until two months prior to his passing. Funeral services were held on Thursday at St. Peter's Church with the Rev. F. W. Buehler officiating. Edward was interred in the mausoleum at St. Joseph City (Lakeview) Cemetery. His death notice and funeral notice were both printed on the first page of the Herald-Palladium, the local newspaper. [2]

The eldest child of Edward and Wilhelmina Gast, Gustav Henry Gast was born in Germany on January 12, 1872. He was ten years old when his family moved to Saint Joseph, Michigan. The 1892 Berrien County Directory lists Gustav Gast as an apprentice at St. Joseph Iron Works. In August of 1897, Gustav enlisted in the Navy. He was placed on the Baltimore as an ordinary seaman while the cruiser was



stationed in the Hawaiian Islands, but in a short time was promoted to a higher position, and later on, still further promoted to the position of gunner. He served in the Spanish-American War, earning the Manila Bay Medal. After the war he became a well-known letter carrier for the St. Joseph Post Office. Gustav H. Gast married Agnes Schneider on December 31, 1900 in St. Joseph. Gustav was a member of the St. Joseph Lodge of Elks, serving as Exalted Ruler in 1915 and again in 1924. Gustav died on December 10, 1930 and was buried in Crystal Springs Cemetery in Benton Harbor. [3]

Agnes Schneider – wife of Gustave Henry Gast

Agnes Schneider was born on June 2, 1876 in Chicago, Illinois to August and Marie (Mess) Schneider. She became Mrs. Gustav Gast on December 31, 1900 and they had two children; Carmon Marie, and Wilbur Edward Gast. Agnes was a member of the First Congregational Church of St. Joseph. She was also a member of The Mary Preston Circle of the church, the Spanish American War Veterans Auxiliary, and the St. Joseph Order of the Eastern Star. In her later years, Agnes lived with the family of her son Wilbur in Battle Creek, Michigan.

Agnes was 92 years old when she died on March 12, 1969. She had been a patient at Battle Creek Community Hospital for the five days preceding her death. Funeral services were held at the First Congregational Church in St. Joseph with the Dr. George Fisk, pastor of the church, officiating. Agnes was buried with Gustav and Carmon in Crystal Springs Cemetery in Benton Harbor. [4]

Her funeral was conducted at the First Congregational Church by the Rev. G. E. Maggart. Carmon was buried in Crystal Springs Cemetery in Benton Harbor. [5]

Wilbur Edward Gast was born in St. Joseph, Michigan on April 22, 1908 to Gustav and Agnes Gast. He married Elizabeth Marion Abbey on June 2, 1929 at the parsonage of The First Christian Church in South Bend, Indiana with the Rev. Elmer Ward Cole officiating. The 1940 U.S. Census lists Wilbur as an Account Trust Officer at a bank. Wilbur died on August 20, 1991 and was buried with Elizabeth and his daughters in Battle Creek Memorial Park Cemetery. [6]

Elizabeth Marion Abbey - wife of Wilbur Edward Gast

Elizabeth Marion Abbey was born on September 1, 1911 in Michigan to J. Lynn and Lillian J. Abbey. She married Wilbur Edward Gast on June 2, 1929 in South Bend, Indiana.

They lived in Battle Creek, Michigan. Wilbur and Elizabeth had two daughters, Joann and Lois Ann Gast, and a son, John Henry Gast. Elizabeth died on February 24, 1988 and was buried with her daughters in Memorial Park Cemetery in Battle Creek, Michigan. [7]

Emma L. Gast was born in Germany on November 3, 1875. While she does not appear in any U.S. Census records with her parents, she lists Edward Gast as her father on her marriage license. She married James Archie Hinkle on November 24, 1897 and they had a son, Floyd, and two daughters; Gladys and Mary. Emma appears with Archie and infant Floyd in the 1900 census in Benton Harbor, Michigan. In 1907 the family moved to Elkhart, Indiana. Emma is listed in the 1910 and 1920 U.S. Censuses, living with the family in Elkhart. In 1923 Emma's health took a turn for the worse. She spent several months at the end of the year in a bed-ridden state. Emma Hinkle died on Monday, January 7, 1924 at 11:00 P.M. Funeral services were conducted by a Christian Science reader on the following Thursday at the Charles Walley Funeral Home in Elkhart. Emma was buried in Crystal Springs Cemetery in Benton Harbor. [8]

Archie James Hinkle - husband of Emma L. Gast

Archie James Hinkle was born on December 13, 1874 in Delaware, Ohio to Ashley and Mary Hinkle. He married Emma L. Gast on November 24, 1897 in St. Peter's Church in St. Joseph, Michigan. Their marriage license lists Archie's brother Harry Hinkle, and Emma's sister Martha as witnesses. The ceremony was performed by Pastor J. L. Kling. After Emma died, Archie married Eva Hogue Merritt in South Bend, Indiana on July 11, 1926. In the 1930 census, Archie, Eva, and Floyd are listed as living together in Niles, Michigan.

Archie died in February of 1953 in Sumnerville, a small village between Niles and Dowagiac, Michigan. At the time of his death, Archie was the owner of a filling station in Sumnerville. He was buried with Emma in Crystal Springs Cemetery in Benton Harbor. Eva died in 1966 and was buried in the Eau Claire (Michigan) Cemetery. [9]

Floyd Archie Hinkle was born in Benton Harbor, Michigan on April 14, 1900. He is listed as an infant with Archie and Emma in the 1900 U.S. Census. Floyd married Ellen B. Tirrell on November 22, 1924 but she died just after their first wedding anniversary.

Floyd is listed in the 1930 census living with his father and step-mother in Niles, Michigan. Later, he married Hazel E. Wyant and they lived in Niles, Eau Claire, and then Hartford, Michigan. Floyd became the Standard Oil Dealer in Hartford where he worked for twenty-eight years before retiring. After retirement, Floyd and Hazel moved to Naples, Florida. To keep himself occupied Floyd worked for Ingram Chevrolet in Naples. He died on Sunday, November 1, 1958 at Naples Community Hospital. The Rev. Tracy Day Spencer of the Naples First Presbyterian Church conducted services at the Richard A. Pittman Funeral Chapel on November 5 and Floyd was buried in Crest Lawn Cemetery. Pallbearers included Charles McCrone, Lloyd Hill, Warren Stamp, Burless Stallons, S. W. Shuart, and Robert Martin. [10]

Ellen B. Tirrell - wife of Floyd A. Hinkle

Ellen B. Tirrell was born on November 1, 1906 in Michigan to Leslie and Arley Tirrell. Her father was the inventor and patent holder for several pieces of chemical spraying equipment and was a co-founder of the Tirrell Manufacturing Company in Bridgman, Michigan, the predecessor of the Gast Manufacturing Company. Ellen married Floyd A. Hinkle on November 22, 1924. Unfortunately, she contracted tuberculosis about two months after her marriage. Ellen died on November 25, 1925 at age 19 at her parent's home. She was buried in the New Troy Cemetery in Weesaw Township, Berrien County, Michigan. [11]

Hazel Ester Wyant - second wife of Floyd A. Hinkle

Hazel Ester Wyant was born around 1911 in Michigan to Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Wyant. She married Floyd A. Hinkle and they lived in Hartford, Michigan where they raised a daughter. After Floyd's death in 1958, Hazel lived in Naples, Florida until around 1972, when she moved to Palm Springs, California. In Palm Springs, Hazel was employed as an apartment manager for Sam Pascal, Inc.

Hazel died in Palm Springs on November 12, 1977. Funeral services were held on Wednesday, November 16 from the Wiefels & Son Funeral Chapel with the Rev. Jack Morrow, pastor of Desert Chapel, officiating. Hazel was buried with Floyd in the Crest Lawn Cemetery in Naples, Florida. [12]

Cemetery records indicate that Gerald A. Hinkle was born to Archie and Emma Hinkle in Michigan on April 16, 1903. This would have made Gerald a twin brother to Gladys M. Hinkle. Gerald died at 10:00 AM in Benton Harbor, Michigan on Wednesday, November 9, 1904 after a long illness. Gerald was buried in Crystal Springs Cemetery.[13]

Gladys M. Hinkle was born to Archie and Emma Hinkle in Michigan on April 17, 1903. She lived most of her life in Elkhart, Indiana. Gladys married Norman B. Sage in the 1920s and they had a son, Norman J. Sage, around 1929. After Norman Sr. died in 1947, Gladys married J. Dana Cramer on October 24, 1953 in Elkhart. Gladys died at General Hospital in Elkhart on Thursday, February 21, 1957 after a three-month illness. Funeral services were held at the Walley Funeral Home on the following Monday with the Rev. Elmer Baker of the First Congregational Church officiating. Gladys was buried in Grace Lawn Cemetery in Elkhart. [14]

Norman B. Sage - husband of Gladys M. Hinkle

Norman B. Sage was born on October 2, 1902 in Elkhart, Indiana to Franklin and Jennie Sage. He was a prominent realtor in the Elkhart area. Norman married Gladys M. Hinkle on May 2, 1926. He was a member of the local Elks Lodge and the Christiana County Club.

On Sunday, August 17, 1947 Norman drowned while swimming in the St. Joseph River with other family members. He was noted as being an excellent swimmer. Witness accounts said the there was no outcry and the rest of the party assumed Norman had returned to the house. Upon finding his clothes at the house, they returned to the river and found him. Artificial respiration was deployed for about twenty-five minutes to no avail. An autopsy revealed that he had also suffered a heart attack, presumably while swimming. His obituary was printed on the front page of the Elkhart Truth on Monday, August 18 and on page two on August 23, 1947. Private funeral services were held the following Wednesday at the Sage home with the Rev. Russell B. Kern of the Trinity Methodist Church officiating. Burial followed in Grace Lawn Cemetery. [15]

Joseph Dana Cramer - second husband of Gladys M. Hinkle

Joseph Dana Cramer was born on August 21, 1888 in Martinsville, Indiana to Dayton and Katherine Dana Cramer. Mr. Cramer managed the Chase Bag Company in Goshen, Indiana until he retired in January of 1955. He married Joyce M. Kinney in Elkhart in 1917, but she passed away in 1926. He then married Myra E. Neidig in 1928, also in Elkhart. Myra died in 1944. Joseph married Gladys M. Hinkle Sage on October 24, 1953.

Joseph died unexpectedly at his home shortly after midnight on Tuesday, October 4, 1955. His obituary was printed on page two of the Elkhart Truth on October 4 and October 5, 1955. Funeral services were held on Thursday at the First Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Andrew Hardie officiating. Burial was in Voilett Cemetery in Goshen. [16]

Mary L. Hinkle was born to Archie and Emma Hinkle in Elkhart, Indiana on August 6, 1911. After her mother dies in 1924, she went to live with her sister and brother-in-law, Norman and Gladys (Hinkle) Sage. She was a winter resident of St. Petersburg, Florida from 1928 to 1931. A teen-ager at the time, she enrolled at St. Petersburg Junior College to study biology. She returned to Indiana to marry William J. Alford in 1941 and raise a family. They lived in Elkhart and then South Bend. Mary had a career as a medical technologist, but volunteering was a major part of her life. In addition to working as a volunteer for the Red Cross in South Bend, she initiated the Reading for the Blind-Dyslexic Service. After William died, Mary continued to live in South Bend until she returned to St. Petersburg, Florida in 1978.

Soon after moving to St. Petersburg, Mary quickly made her experience available to the local Red Cross chapter. After two years as Chairman of Volunteers and then Chairman of the Volunteer Personnel Committee, she was appointed the position of Chairman of Disaster Volunteers in 1984 - just in time for Hurricane Elena the following year. When the hurricane forced the evacuation of thousands of people into South Pinellas County shelters, Mary was the first volunteer called in. During a 55-hour crisis, she alerted people who had agreed to serve during disasters, then went after new volunteers, eventually turning to professional nursing organizations to beg for more help. When the crisis was over, her work was still not done: She had to send out letters thanking those who had helped. For her work, the chapter's board of directors presented her with a marble and bronze plaque in November of 1985 and passed a resolution of its appreciation. After moving to Seminole, Florida in 1986, Mary cut back on her Red Cross work, but still found time to spend a day a week at the St. Petersburg Free Clinic as a receptionist. She also served as a volunteer for Meals on Wheels and the Largo Library. Mary was a member of Holy Cross Catholic Church in St. Petersburg.

Mary Alford died on Tuesday, November 1, 1988 in Seminole, Florida in a fatal traffic accident that occurred near her residence. Her obituary was printed in the St. Petersburg Times on November 4, 1988. It also appeared on page B6 of the Elkhart Truth and on page C5 of The South Bend Tribune on the same day. A memorial service was held at Anderson-McQueen Funeral Home on the following Friday. A Funeral Mass was held at 10 a.m. on Saturday at Holy Cross Catholic Church. Final services were in South Bend, Indiana with burial in St. Joseph Valley Memorial Park, Granger, Indiana. [17]

William J. Alford - husband of Mary L. Hinkle

William J. Alford was born on July 17, 1907 in Dublin, Ireland. In 1930, he immigrated to the United States and located in the South Bend area. William married Mary L. Hinkle

on November 21, 1941 in South Bend, Indiana. During World War II, he served as a Captain in the Army Air Corps. William retired from a career at the Midland Engineering Company, where he held the position of Controller. He was a member of the Hibernians: Council 593, the Knights of Columbus, and the Holy Name Society of St. Matthew Cathedral. William died at his home on Friday, August 30, 1974, after an extended illness. His obituary was printed on page 28 of The South Bend Tribune on August 30, and on page 36 on September 1, 1974. Funeral services were held on Tuesday, September 3, 1974 at St. Matthew Cathedral with Rev. Edmond Murray officiating. Burial followed in St. Joseph Valley Memorial Park. [18]

Martha Marie Gast was born in Germany on June 25, 1879. She married James Dwan on October 5, 1899 and they had a daughter Marion Dwan. Martha's mother, Minnie, was listed in the 1920 census as living with the family shortly before she died. Martha Dwan was a prominent member of St. John's Catholic Church, its Altar Society, and the Order of the Maccabees. In December of 1938, she fell down the stairs in her home, sustaining a concussion and fractured ribs. Martha died on Wednesday, January 25, 1939. While she does not appear in any U.S. Census records with her parents' family, Edward Gast and Wilhelmina Hinz are listed as her parents on her entry in Michigan Deaths and Burials 1800-1995. Her obituary also lists Albert, Henry, and Fred Gast as her brothers. Martha was buried in Calvary Cemetery the following Saturday. [19]

James U. Dwan - husband of Martha Gast

James U. Dwan was born in Niles, Michigan on May 26, 1874. He moved to Benton Harbor around 1894 and married Martha Marie Gast on October 5, 1899. James Dwan was a well-known businessman in the Twin Cities area. He built the luxurious Hotel Dwan and Mineral Bathhouse in Benton Harbor with his brother Edward Dwan in 1912 and ran it for several years. He was also involved with several other businesses in St. Joseph, Benton Harbor, and Holland, Michigan. Mr. Dwan was honored by the Benton Harbor American Legion Post 105 on his 85th birthday for a life-time of community service. He was a member of St. John's Catholic Church and the Benton Harbor Elks Lodge No. 544. James U. Dwan died in Mercy Hospital on the evening of January 17, 1970 at the age of 95. He was buried with Martha in Calvary Cemetery. [20]

Marion M. Dwan was born in Michigan on May 9, 1906 to James and Martha (Gast) Dwan. After she graduated from the parochial high school at St. John's Catholic Church in Benton Harbor, Marion studied at the Conservatory of Music at St. Mary's College in South Bend, Indiana. She taught in the Junior Music Department at St. Mary's after her graduation. Marion married Louis J. Patton in St. John's Catholic Church on June 25, 1930 in an elaborate ceremony that was deemed a brilliant social event of the season. Marion was a noted musician and private music teacher in St. Joseph society, with articles regard-

ing her performances appearing in several of the local newspapers throughout her life. Marion was a member of St. John's Catholic Church and Altar Society. She was a lifetime member of Berrien Hills Country Club, a past president of the Monday Musical Club, and a member of the Mercy Hospital Auxiliary Club.

Marion died on Tuesday, July 21, 1988 at the Lakeland Continuing Care Center in St. Joseph. A Mass of Christian Burial was held at St. John's on Friday and she was buried with Louis in Calvary Cemetery. [21]

Louis J. Patton - husband of Marian M. Dwan

Louis J. Patton was born on March 4, 1906 in Michigan to Frank and Agnes Patton. After attending the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, he operated the Dixie Empire filling station. Louis married Marian M. Dwan on June 25, 1930 in St. John's Catholic Church in Benton Harbor. In 1934, along with Horace J. Terrill, Louis applied for, and was granted, a patent for an automobile wheel holder. In addition to being a co-owner of Patton Brothers Appliances Louis' name appeared, along with his father-in-law, James Dwan (who, by 1940, was making his home with his daughter and son-in-law), in numerous business venture announcements in the twin cities area. Louis died on October 1, 1980 and was buried in Calvary Cemetery. [22]

Grace Marie Gast was born in Germany in March of 1881. She is listed as a witness at the respective marriages of her brother Gustav, and sister Martha. Grace is also listed as living with the family under the name Margaret in the 1900 U. S. Census. On May 5, 1909,

Grace Marie Gast married Wilbur Griffith Miller in St. Joseph, Michigan. Mrs. Wilbur Miller of Lansing is listed as one of the surviving daughters in Wilhelmina Hinz Gast's obituary. The 1920 census shows the couple living in Lansing, Michigan with a son, James A. Miller.

Mrs. Wilbur Miller died on Friday morning, September 9, 1921 at Mercy Hospital in Benton Harbor, Michigan. Funeral services were held on the following Sunday at the home of her sister, Mrs. James Dwan. The Rev. Percy V. Dawe of the St. Joseph Congregational Church rendered the eulogy and Grace was buried in Crystal Springs Cemetery in Benton Harbor. [23]

Wilbur Griffith Miller - husband of Grace Marie Gast

Wilbur Griffith Miller was born on December 30, 1878 in Michigan to John D. and Abbey McLaughlin Miller. Wilbur married Grace Marie Gast on May 5, 1909 in St. Joseph, Michigan. Their marriage license lists Wilbur's occupation as a machinist. His 1918 World War I Draft Card lists him as a lathe foreman for the Reliance Engineering Company. After Grace died, Wilbur remarried on September 18, 1926 with Jessie Elvira Blodgett in Munger (Bay County), Michigan and moved back to Benton Harbor. Wilbur was a long-standing member of the Benton Harbor Elks Lodge No. 544, as well as the Lakeshore Masonic Lodge and the First Congregational Church. He retired from the Seranac Machine Company in 1945.

Wilbur Griffith Miller died on September 10, 1949 at Mercy Hospital after a three month heart ailment. A large number of mourners filled the funeral chapel when the Rev. Howard A. Blanning of the First Congregational Church conducted funeral services. Past Grand Master Roscoe J. Burra of the Lake Shore Masonic Lodge, acting as chaplain, gave the Masonic funeral oration. Wilbur was buried with Grace in Crystal Springs Cemetery. Casket bearers included; Arthur Jennings, Nathan L. Dodson, Edward (unreadable), Harold Morse, Millard Larke, and Gale Smith. Jessie raised Wilbur's son, James, as her own until her death in April of 1986. [24]

James A. Miller was born in Michigan on March 15, 1916. He was only five years old when his mother died in 1921. James later attended Benton Harbor High School. He was serving as a radio instructor in the U. S. Army when he married Mary Teresa McCrina on July 6, 1943. The wedding was conducted in the Annie Banyon chapel of the First Congregational Church, Benton Harbor, while he was on leave from his post at Camp Swift, Texas. In the fall of 1950, James received authorization under the G. I. Bill to begin studies at Benton Harbor Junior College toward receiving a degree in elementary teaching. He

completed those studies with a 4.0 grade point average in January of 1952. He then enrolled at the University of Texas, graduating in 1954. He was a teacher, first in Pattison, Texas, then, from 1956 to 1967, in Benton Harbor, Michigan, where he was also in charge of the school newspaper, "The Tiger." His philosophy classes were among the first in the country to be taught at a high school level. In 1965 James Miller was awarded a "John Hay Fellowship" and he attended Yale University for a year. In 1967 he moved to the Coloma School System and worked there until his retirement in 1979. In 1972, James was the speaker for the Algonquin Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution's Good Citizen Award dinner. James was the originator of a television show called "The Quiz Bowl" which aired for many years on the local television station, WHFB. He was a member of the Berrien County Retired Teachers Association and the National Association of Retired Teachers. James also played drums with the Twin Cities Symphony and with various local bands.

After the death of his wife, Mary (McCrina) Miller, James was married to Madeline Phillips. James A. Miller died on Sunday, July 23, 1995 at Berrien General Hospital in Berrien Center, Michigan. Funeral services were held on Wednesday at the Dey-Florin Chapel in St. Joseph. He was buried in Crystal Springs Cemetery in Benton Harbor. [25]

Mary Teresa McCrina - wife of James A. Miller

Mary Teresa McCrina was born on April 6, 1918 in Coburn, Pennsylvania to Frank and Edna (Keen) McCrina. She graduated from Williamsport (PA) High School and then from Bucknell University in



1940. Mary served in the U. S. Signal Corps and was stationed in Chicago. She married James Miller on July 6, 1943. Mary continued her teaching position at Williamsport High School while her husband completed his obligation to the U. S. Army. She served several years as her class reporter for the Bucknell University alumni magazine, writing updates about the lives of her and her fellow Bucknellian classmates. The Frank and Edna Keen McCrina Memorial Scholarship at Bucknell University was established through a bequest from Mary McCrina Miller in memory of her parents. Preferences for the scholarship are given to students majoring in the humanities. In 1969, Mr. and Mrs. James Miller were living in Benton Harbor when their only daughter, Martha Dwan Miller, married Carlton Wesley Depner. She was a volunteer for the Department of Social Services and a member of the Ossoli Club.

Mary died at home on October 3, 1989. Her body was donated to the University of Michigan Medical School and a memorial service was held later at the First Congregational Church where she was a member. A marker was placed in the Fairview Cemetery in Milheim, Pennsylvania. [26]

Madeline Phillips - second wife of James A. Miller

Madeline Phillips was born October 23, 1916 in Benton Harbor to Oscar and Elsie Phillips. She graduated from Benton Harbor High School, teaching dance in the area in her

early years. Much of her childhood was spent at the House of David, often found riding their float in the Blossom Parade as her father was a police officer for them for over forty years. She then moved to Chicago and commuted to Sister Lakes on weekends with her family for many years. Later she built a home with her first husband, Solan Emery on the Islands of Paw Paw Lake. In the late 1980's, she married James A. Miller. Madeline died on December 31, 2008 and was cremated. Her ashes were buried next to her parents in Crystal Springs Cemetery in Benton Harbor. [27]

Edward August Gast was born on November 4, 1882 in Covert, Michigan. He was the first member of the Gast family to be born in the United States. Edward married Clara Anna Wilson in Chicago (Cook County), Illinois on June 4, 1906. They made their home in St. Joseph, Michigan where Edward began his business career as a clerk in the E. S. Gurran Drug Store. Together with Charles Schaefer, Edward founded the Gast Drug Company. He continued in the pharmaceutical business until around 1923. Edward was also prominent in local Republican politics. He was appointed to the position of Postmaster by U. S. Congressman John C. Ketcham on February 16, 1922. Edward served eight years as the Postmaster in the St. Joseph Post Office. He was active in many civic projects, notably the Blossom Festival, the Twin Cities Civic Music Association, and the St. Joseph-Benton Harbor Rotary Club. Edward served as president of the Rotary Club and was a member of the board of directors of Mercy Hospital. He was also a member of the local Masonic and Elks Lodges, as well as the Berrien Hills Country Club.

Edward died on Monday, July 24, 1933 from a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head while at home. He had reportedly been despondent over his failing health. Funeral services were conducted the following Wednesday at the First Congregational Church. The Rev. George Horst, pastor of the church, officiated. Burial was in Riverview Cemetery in St. Joseph. [28]

Clara Anna Wilson - wife of Edward August Gast

Clara Anna Wilson was born in Chicago, Illinois on October 19, 1884 to Frederick W. and Mary Wilson. She married Edward August Gast in Chicago, Illinois on June 4, 1906 and they had two sons, Edward W. and Harold Myron Gast (Myron was also the name of Clara's younger brother). Clara was a member of the Knights of the Maccabees and the St. Joseph Order of the Eastern Star. Clara died in the Alma Masonic Home in Alma (Gratiot County), Michigan on Tuesday, February 5, 1963. She was 78. Funeral services were held on the following Friday at the Kerlikowske, Starks & Beatty Funeral Home with the Rev. Frank O. Kruger of the First Christian Church, Benton Harbor, officiating. A group of employees from Theisen-Clemens Co. formed an honor guard outside the funeral home.

Casket bearers were George, A. Karl, and Robert Gast, Jim Miller, and Wilbur and Clarence Wendt. Clara was buried in Riverview Cemetery in St. Joseph. [29]

Edward W. Gast was born to Edward and Clara Gast on February 17, 1912 in Michigan. He served as best man at his brother's wedding in 1940. The 1940 U. S. Census lists him as living in South Bend, Indiana with his wife, Sue, and sons; Edward (age two), and Paul Charles (infant). In a newspaper article in the Benton Harbor News Palladium on November 10, 1971 Edward was announced as a candidate for the St. Joseph Elks Lodge No. 541. His cousin Robert H. Gast was listed as a sponsor. Edward died on April 1, 1986. [30]

Albert Karl (A. K.) Gast was born in November 1884. On October 2, 1915 he married Maitland Piper in Washington, D.C. Albert was the founder and president of the Star Shade Cutter Company, a firm that produces machines used for cutting window shades. He established the business in 1907 and registered several patents for inventions pertaining to his company's products. The company is still in business, and is still family-owned.



A. K. died on Monday, August 13, 1956 and was buried in Riverview Cemetery in St. Joseph, Michigan on Thursday after a private funeral. The Rev. Wayne E. Weiz of St. Peter's Evangelical and Reformed Church officiated. Casket bearers included Elmer Cress, Fred Palenske, Charles Gore, Warren Correll, Nathan Preston, and John Preston. [34]

Geraldine Maitland Piper Gertman was born on August 25, 1887 in Pennsylvania to Gerald and Minnie (Deith) Piper. She married Albert Karl Gast in Washington D. C. on October 2, 1915. Her engagement announcement was published in the Washington Post on June 13, 1915. A. K. and Maitland lived in Ohio after they were married. The 1920 U. S. Census lists them, along with Florence and George, as living with her mother and stepfather in Washington D. C. Eventually they settled in St. Joseph, Michigan in the early 1920's. Their last two children were born in Michigan. In February of 1940 Maitland

attended the graduation of her oldest daughter, Florence, from George Washington University in Washington D. C. Maitland died at home in St. Joseph on May 23, 1963 and was buried with Albert in Riverview Cemetery. [35]

Afterwards, Robert was transferred to the Signal Corps headquarters on Governor's Island in New York. Robert later remarried (June) and, on D-Day, had a daughter, Barbara June Gast. A service note published in the Benton Harbor News Palladium on February 3, 1945 stated that Sgt. Robert Gast was one of sixty soldiers on a work furlough to assist in a worker shortage at the Dayton Rubber Manufacturing Company. After the war, Robert became a foreman at the Industrial Rubber Company in St. Joseph. He retired from that position. On October 3, 1964 Robert gave his daughter, Barbara, away at the altar when she married Edward Wise at the Zion Evangelical Reformed Church in St. Joseph. In a newspaper article in the Benton Harbor News Palladium on November 10, 1971 Robert was listed as a sponsor for new members of the St. Joseph Elks Lodge 541. His cousin, Edward W. Gast, was listed among the candidates. Robert gave his daughter, Victoria, away at the altar when she married Raymond Russell, Jr. at the Zion Evangelical Reformed Church in St. Joseph on August 6, 1973.

Robert died from cancer on Monday, April 22, 1991 at Berrien General Hospital in Berrien Center, Michigan. Funeral services were held on Wednesday at Kerley & Starks Funeral Home in St. Joseph. [47]

June Thompson - wife of Robert H. Gast

June Rose Thompson was born on April 29, 1919 in Churubusco, Indiana to Guy and Ida (Miller) Thompson. She appears with her family in the 1920 U. S. Census in Smith Township, Whitley County, Indiana. The family appears in the 1930 census in Coloma, Michigan. June married Robert Henry Gast on January 21, 1939 in South Bend, Indiana. A Michigan Death Certificate lists the death of a male infant on September 6, 1939 who had been born the previous day in Benton Harbor to Robert Gast and Jane Thompson. Although the Benton Harbor News Palladium reported they were granted a divorce on May 20, 1940, Robert and June apparently remarried and had two daughters; Barbara June and Victoria Ann Gast. Mrs. Robert H. Gast was listed in several local newspaper articles as being active in area charities and causes including the Michigan Heart Association. She retired as a secretary from the Whirlpool Corporation in St. Joseph in 1976. June was also a member of the Whirlpool Oldtimers Club and a board member of the YMCA. June Rose Thompson Gast died on June 5, 1982 at Memorial Hospital in St. Joseph. Her body was cremated and her ashes were interred in North Shore Memory Gardens. [48]

Charles Edward Gast was born to Henry and Marguerite (Hinds) Gast on March 2, 1915 in St. Joseph, Michigan. In 1928 he spent several days in the hospital recovering from emergency surgery for appendicitis. On June 29, 1936 Charles married Mary Alice Warren in South Bend, Indiana. They divorced in April of 1939. On September 25, 1939 Charles married Doris E. Mitchell at a Methodist parsonage in South Bend, Indiana with Doris's sister and brother-in-law witnessing the event. During World War II Charles served in the U. S. Army. A service note published in the Benton Harbor News Palladium on October 6, 1943 stated that Pfc. Charles Gast had been transferred from Fort Monmouth, N. Y. to Camp Eustis, Va. After getting divorced from Doris in 1946 Charles married Mary Virginia Thomas and they had a daughter. Unfortunately, they divorced in 1951. Charles worked for his father in the service department at the Twin Cities Chevrolet dealership until shortly after his father's death. In mid-1955, Charles moved to Phoenix, Arizona. Charles died unexpectedly at his home in Phoenix on Sunday, December 6, 1959. Funeral services were held at the Kerlikowske Funeral Home on the following Saturday with the Rev. E. A. Irion, pastor of Zion Evangelical and Reformed Church officiating. Burial was in Riverview Cemetery in St. Joseph. [49]

Mary Alice Warren - wife of Charles E. Gast

Mary Alice Warren was the first wife of Charles E. Gast. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. N. Warren of Benton Harbor. Mary Alice and Charles were married in South Bend, Indiana on June 29, 1936. When they divorced in 1939 Mary Alice reverted to her maiden name of Warren. They had no children together. No other information about Mary Alice has been located. [50]

Doris E. Mitchell - second wife of Charles E. Gast

Doris E. Mitchell was the second wife of Charles E. Gast. Doris was a daughter of local fire chief William Hudson Mitchell. She and Charles were married in South Bend, Indiana on September 25, 1939. In the 1940 census she is listed as living with her parents. Doris and Charles were granted a divorce in July of 1946. At the time of her father's death in 1972, she was listed in the obituary as Mrs. Thomas Lupton. No other information about her has been located. [51]

Mary Virginia Thomas - third wife of Charles E. Gast

Mary Virginia Thomas was the third wife of Charles E. Gast. Virginia was born to Clay and Rena Thomas on May 6, 1923 in Lyford, Indiana. In the 1940 US Census she is listed with her parents, two sisters and one brother in Benton Harbor, Michigan. In early August, 1946 she and Charles E. Gast filed for a marriage license. They married over the following weekend. In October of 1947, Virginia gave birth to the couple's only child, a daughter whom they named Sandra. According to family accounts, Virginia moved to Texas after divorcing Charles in 1951, taking Sandra with her, and later remarried. Mary Virginia Chapman died in Arlington, Texas on December 27, 2008 of natural causes. No other information about her has been located at this time. [52]

Lois Gast - fourth wife of Charles E. Gast

Lois Gast was the fourth wife of Charles E. Gast. She is listed on her husband's death certificate and in his obituary, but no other information about her has been found. [53]

The youngest son of Edward and Minnie Gast, Frederick Gast was born in January of 1889. He met Edna Mae Bassett in St. Joseph in the summer of 1913. They married in Anderson, Indiana on February 23, 1914. Fred and Edna Mae lived in Bridgman, Michigan until shortly after the stock market crash of 1929. In the 1920s Fred was the treasurer of the Bridgman State Bank and owned several other local businesses. The great depression

hit the family hard. The bank and Fred's other businesses were closed. With no means of income in Bridgman, the family moved to Chicago to live with one of Edna Mae's aunts.

Life did not improve and in 1932 the family relocated to Corbett, Oregon where Fred and Edna reopened and operated The Crown Point Chalet, a restaurant at the west end of the Columbia River Gorge. The Chalet, was changed into an authentic German restaurant. The Chalet provided the most authentic German food in the area. According to family lore, the Chalet hosted officers and crew of the last German naval ship (a cruiser) to call in Portland before the Second World War. Unfortunately, the restaurant was closed after just a couple of years due to the poor economic conditions and the family moved to Portland.

In the 1940 U. S. Census, Fred and his wife, Mae B. Gast, are listed as living in Portland, Oregon with their two youngest sons, Garrett and Graydon. After Edna Mae died, Fred married Minnie B. Gross. In Portland, Fred supported the family by holding a number of jobs; movie theater manager, life insurance agent, and Social Security Administration Administrator for Multnomah County, Oregon. His last position was Comptroller for Poole, Maghonigal, and Dick, a local structural steel fabricator.

Fred died at his home in Portland, Oregon on February 29, 1956. His remains were entombed at Wilhelm's Portland Memorial Mausoleum after his funeral on March 3, 1956. [54]

Mae Edna Bassett - wife of Frederick Gast

Mae Edna Bassett was born on October 2, 1893 in Indiana to Charles and Carrie Ann (Ainsworth) Bassett. Her father's family lineage has been traced back to William Bassett and the founders of the Plymouth Colony in Massachusetts. It is through the Bassett family that Gast decedents are directly related to Miles Standish and John Alden, signers of the Mayflower Compact.

One of ten children, Mae grew up in Anderson, Indiana where her father operated a jewelry store until he died suddenly in 1912. Mae married Frederick Gast at her mother's home in Anderson, Indiana on Monday, February 23, 1914. From the account in the Anderson Herald on the following Saturday, news of the marriage came as a surprise to local friends. The couple had intended to keep the union secret until the following Monday, but the newspaper announcement preceded that by two days. Fred and Mae made their home in Bridgman, Michigan where they had three sons; Frederick C., Garrett A., and Graydon Gast. In 1932 she moved to Oregon with her family and helped run the Crown Point Chalet as the family emerged from the grips of the depression. The Chalet quickly became known for providing the most authentic German food in the area. Head cook Mae's specialty was a German Sauerbraten recipe that had been passed on to her from Wilhelmina Hinz Gast. This recipe has since been passed on and enjoyed as the traditional dish for Gast family holiday dinners.

Mae's mother died while visiting the family in Portland in 1937. Mae died in 1941 in Portland. She is interred in a niche with her son Fred and his wife, Rosalind, in the mausoleum at River View Cemetery in Portland. [55]

Minnie Gross - second wife of Frederick William Gast

Minnie Gross was born in August of 1896. In the U. S. Census for 1900, she is listed as living with her widowed mother Francis and sister Bertha in Athena Town, Umatilla,

Oregon. She married Fred Gast sometime after 1940. According to family accounts, Minnie's family owned a large wheat farm in northeastern Oregon and she held an interest in that farm well into her latter years. Minnie died on December 22, 1956 and her remains were entombed with Fred's at Wilhelm's Portland Memorial Mausoleum. [56]

The oldest son of Fred and Edna Mae was Frederick Charles Gast. He was born on August 9, 1916 in Bridgman, Michigan. Fred attended Grant High School in Portland, graduating in 1934. Moving to San Francisco, Fred went to work for IBM. In 1937 he married his high school sweetheart, Rosalind Ferris. In 1939, he was employed by the state of Oregon and became controller and assistant commissioner in charge of fiscal operations for the State Industrial Accident Commission. In the 1940 U. S. Census, Fred and Rosalind are listed as living in Portland, Oregon with their two year old son, Fred. They later moved to Salem, Oregon where Fred worked as the Comptroller of the State Industrial Accident Commission. In 1952 the family moved back to Portland where Fred worked for United Grocers as an office manager. He also served as assistant general manager until 1968, when he was appointed executive vice president and general manager. Fred retired from United Grocers in 1982 as General Manger and CEO. He was also a member of the Columbia Edgewater Country Club and Masonic Lodge.

Fred C. Gast died in Portland, Oregon on Saturday, April 4, 1987. After funeral services on Thursday, April 9 at the Adams Chapel of River View Cemetery, Fred's remains were interred with Rosalind's in the Riverview Mausoleum. [57]

Rosalind P. Ferris - wife of Frederick Charles Gast

Rosalind Pauline Ferris was born on June 24, 1918 to Mr. and Mrs. Walter Longine Ferris in Portland. She attended Grant High School. Rosalind married Fred Gast in 1937 and they raised two sons. As Mrs. Gast, she was appointed and elected to head several women's and civic organization, for a period of 14 years beginning in 1956 and continuing through 1970.

She was elected president in 1960 of the Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs, and was appointed during the 1960s by Oregon Governors. Mark O. Hatfield and Tom McCall to the Oregon Council on Crime and Delinquency, the Governor's Committee for Children and Youth and the Governor's Advisory Committee on Arts and Humanities.

In 1963, Rosalind was selected as one of four panelists to appear with Secretary of State Dean Rusk on the premiere of the television series "Women on the Move," a show that addressed world affairs. At the time she was first vice president of the Western States Conference of the General Federation of Women's Clubs. Rosalind also was elected recording secretary of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, a nationwide organization, and

served as president of the Salem Junior Women's Clubs, Portland Zenith Club, and Marion County Federation of Women's Clubs. Her activities also included membership in the Japanese Garden Society, Portland President's Club and Portland Sorosis.

Rosalind died in a Portland hospital on August 26, 1985. After funeral services, held at the Riverview Cemetery Chapel on Friday, August 30, her remains were interred in a niche at the Riverview Cemetery Mausoleum in Portland. [58]

The middle son of Fred and Edna was Garrett Ainsworth Gast. He was born April 28, 1918 in Bridgman, Michigan. As a young teen, Garry won the Michigan State Junior Violin Championship. When the Great Depression hit, he relocated with his family to Chicago, and then Portland, Oregon. While attending Grant High School in Portland, Garry met Joan Huggins. They married in 1942. During World War II, Garrett was a Second Lieutenant stationed at Camp Hale, Colorado in the Tenth Mountain Division (ski troops). Following the war he returned to Oregon and founded the Mount Hood Ski School. In 1950 the family moved to Marin County, California where they raised their three children; Garrett Graydon, David Warren, and Betsy Gast. An avid sailor, Garry then moved the family to Belvedere, California where he was an active member of the San Francisco Yacht Club. Garry enjoyed a successful career in the furniture business as a manufacturer's representative from 1950 until he retired in 1981. In 1989 he and Joan moved to Gig Harbor, Washington. There, he was a 20-year member of the Canterwood Golf Club where played golf daily. His last nine holes were played on January 4, 2010. Garrett Ainsworth Gast died peacefully on January 9, 2010 at age ninety-one with his family at his side. [59]

Joan E. Huggins – wife of Garrett A. Gast

Joan Elizabeth Huggins was born in Portland Oregon on April 8, 1921. She was the eldest daughter of Chester and Hilda Huggins. Joan met Garrett Gast while they were students in Grant High School in Portland. They married in 1942. After World War II Joan and Garrett moved back to Portland where they raised two sons and a daughter. Joan, along with Garrett, was a member of the Cascade Ski Club and later help found the Mt. Hood Ski School. After moving the family to Belvedere, California in 1959, Joan was active in the Women's Auxiliary of the San Francisco Yacht Club for many years. She was a volunteer at the Sunny Hills Orphanage and participated in a needlework club. Joan also enjoyed painting, sewing and all kinds of crafts. In 1989 Joan and Garrett moved to Gig Harbor, Washington where Joan joined the 9 Hole Girls golfing group at Canterwood Golf and Country Club. After Garrett's death, Joan lived independently. In 2014 she

moved to Orange County, California to be closer to family. Joan Elizabeth Gast died peacefully, surrounded by her family, on August 18, 2018 at the age of 97. [60]

The youngest son of Fred and Edna Mae was Graydon Gast. He was born on May 5, 1923 in Bridgman, Michigan. When the Great Depression hit, he moved with his family to Chicago, then Oregon. He was seventeen when his mother died from blood poisoning in 1940. After graduating from high school, Graydon enrolled in the Navy. Being placed as a gunnery officer, he lost hearing in one ear after a year of duty and was given an honorable discharge. He began his private life working in a warehouse in Portland, Oregon. When he was promoted to a sales position, he moved to Seattle, Washington. It was in Seattle that Graydon met Rosemary Monley while on a blind date. They married in 1948.

Graydon 'Dick' Gast died from an inoperable brain tumor on October 3, 1988. His remains were cremated and a memorial marker was placed in Calvary Catholic Cemetery in Petaluma, California. [61]


Rosemary Monley - wife of Graydon Gast



Julius Hinz was born on May 14, 1852 in Pomerania. Julius and his brother August immigrated to the United States together. They left Hamburg on November 26, 1882 and sailed directly to New York aboard the SS Bohemia under the command of Captain Pezoldt. The SS Bohemia was constructed in 1881 at the A. & J. Inglis Shipyard in Glasgow with a straight stem, one funnel, and two masts (rigged for sail). She was an iron construction, with a single screw and a service speed of 12 knots. There was accommodation for 100-1st and 1,200-3rd class passengers. The Bohemia docked in the Port of New York on December 15, 1882.

Traveling with Julius was his wife, Adeline Herritz, along with their son Berthold, two daughters Emma and Martha, his mother Charlotte Hinz, Adeline's parents, August Hinz and his family. The passenger manifest for the S. S. Bohemia, spells Julius' last name with the a 't' while his brother August retained the 'Hinz' spelling. Julius and Adeline settled on a farm in Freedom, Wisconsin and established a home in Sauk County. On October 11, 1884, Julius applied for U.S. citizenship. In 1912 they purchased a home in Ableman (now called Rock Springs) and lived there until Adeline died in 1929. Julius spent time with the families of his children until he died on September 24, 1932. Funeral services were held on Tuesday, September 27, 1932 at 2:00 at the Lutheran Church in Ableman. The Reverend R. Lehman conducted the service. Julius and Adelina Heritz Hinz are buried together in St. John's Lutheran Cemetery just north of Rock Springs, Sauk County, Wisconsin. August and his second wife, Augusta Trachsler Hintz, are buried in the same cemetery. [1]

Adeline "Lena" (Heritz) Hintz – wife of Julius Hinz (Generation 1)

Born April 17, 1855 to Henrich and Albertine Herritz in Lubben, Pomerania, Adeline Herritz was the oldest child in her family. She married Julius Hintz in Germany on September 3, 1875. She spent her years with Julius raising their eleven children. Adeline's father, Henrich Herritz, also lived with the family from 1893, when her mother died, until his death in 1908. Adeline was a member of the Lutheran Church and the Lutheran Ladies Aid Society. On November 8, 1929, Adeline suffered from a stroke. She died four days later. Adeline laid in state at the Hintz home, with the Reverend R. E. Popp officiating on Saturday at 1:30 PM and at the Lutheran Church at 2:00 PM. She was buried in St. John's Lutheran Cemetery. [2]

Berthold Charles Hinz was born in Germany on January 25, 1877. He married Sarah Williams on June 27, 1902 in Wisconsin. Their daughter Helen and son Russell were both born in Wisconsin in 1906 and 1908 respectively. By 1913 Bert and his family were living in Creston, Union County, Iowa where he was working in construction. A local newspaper article places him at the construction site of the town's new Presbyterian Church. The 1920 Census shows them as still living in Creston.



In 1930, Bert, Sarah, and Russell were living in Miami, Florida without daughter Helen, who had married Frederick Waterman Ide in Creston in 1927. Also living with the family was Nell Grigsby, the daughter of a family friend from Kansas. On December 6, 1933 Bert gave Nell away in her wedding. The 1935 Florida state census shows the family in Florida and son Russell as having completed college. An article on page eleven of the Miami Daily News in November of 1936 talks about the opening of a new Miami Beach Sears, Roebuck & Co. that was constructed by the Hintz Construction Co. The family was still together in Florida in 1945.

Bert and Sarah returned to Iowa around 1953 for a summer visit. Bert's grandson, Robert Ide, remembers hitchhiking to Florida to help them drive to Iowa. Bert moved back to Creston in January of 1963, three months after Russell's death. Bert was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Creston, the Crest City Lodge No. 522, A.F.&A.M., and the Creston Kiwanis Club. He spent his last few years living near his daugh-



ter and son-in-law in Creston. Bert died on December 1, 1965 [21] in Creston and his remains were cremated following a memorial service. [3]

Sarah Williams – wife of Berthold Hintz

Sarah Williams was born on December 22, 1877 in Wisconsin to Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Williams. Her parents were from Wales. After marrying Bert on June 27, 1902 in Wisconsin, she can be found in census records living with Bert and Russell up to the 1945 Florida state census. A family account has her returning to Iowa with Bert in 1953 for the summer. Also in 1935, Sarah suffered from a stroke which left her paralyzed on her left side. Bert cared for her until she died in Florida on November 2, 1961. Her remains were cremated. [4]

Helen Margaret Hintz was born in Wisconsin on June 16, 1906. Helen was in the bridal party of her cousin, Lila Meyers, when Lila married Emil Gall in June of 1922 in Ableman (Rock Springs). In 1927 Helen married Frederick Waterman Ide in Creston, Iowa and settled in the area. The rest of her family moved to Florida, where Helen became a frequent visitor. Helen raised three sons on the family farm near Creston. She died on November 2, 1990 in the Greater Community Hospital in Creston, twenty-nine years, to-the-day, after



Russell Williams Hintz was born to Bert and Sarah Hintz on September 23, 1908 in Baraboo, Wisconsin. After a few years in Iowa

Russell moved to Florida with his parents. He attended Miami High School, and then, in 1925, was one of the first ten students ever to enroll at the newly-chartered University of Miami. Russell graduated from Vanderbilt University, where he was a member of the Sigma Nu fraternity. His first love was music. Russell Hintz played saxophone and clari-

net in various bands in the Miami area in the 1920s and 1930s; Ross Allen Orchestra, Ray Teale's Orchestra, and Johnny Silvers, to name a few.

On July 15, 1930 Russell married Marjorie Jane Kohlhepp in a grand social wedding at the Miami Beach Community Church. Marjorie and Russell were divorced in 1935. Russell married Emily Stephenson on August 17, 1935. The marriage,



however, only lasted a short time, ending in divorce in 1937. In 1944 Russell was asked to join the Tommy and Jimmy Dorsey Brothers Band, but he declined citing family responsibilities.



Russell later married Bernice Gauvey and they raised a daughter. He lived most of his life in Florida with his mother and father and helped run the family construction business. Russell died on October 2, 1962 and his remains were cremated. [7]

Marjorie Jane Kohlhepp – first wife of Russell Williams Hintz

Marjorie Jane Kohlhepp was born in Kentucky to Walter and Arleen Kohlhepp on June 24, 1914. Her father died in 1929 in Miami Beach, Florida. Marjorie married Russell W. Hintz on July 15, 1930 in Miami Beach and lived in Miami. They divorced in 1935. Marjorie later married Forrest Braden Dawson and had two children. [8]

Emily E. Stephenson – second wife of Russell Williams Hintz

Martha later married Edward Steinbrink but the marriage was terminated and Martha went back to using the surname Meyers. She moved to Florida around 1974.

Martha died on Friday, June 3, 1977 in Winter Garden, Florida. Funeral services for Martha Meyers were held on Tuesday at the Hanson Funeral Home with Pastor Emil G. Toepel officiating. She was buried with Jacob in Walnut Hill Cemetery in Baraboo, Wisconsin. [15]

Jacob Wallace Meyers was born in 1879 in Sauk County, Wisconsin. He married Martha W. Hintz on September 26, 1901 and they had three children. Charlotte died peacefully on April 26, 2008 at St. Clare Hospital in Baraboo. Funeral services were held on Wednesday, April 30, 2008 at 11 a.m. at St. John's Lutheran Church with Pastor Thomas Fricke officiating. Burial followed in Oak Hill Cemetery in North Freedom. Bernice Berkley was the first wife of Rodney Hintz. She was born on May 25, 1918 to William and Ethel Berkley in Baraboo, Wisconsin. Bernice was the mother of Rodney's sons, Rodney, Jr.

(AKA Peter C.) and Bradley K. Hintz. She and Rodney divorced in 1939 and she later remarried. Bernice Sucherek, wife of Edward Sucherek, died on April 19, 1990 in the greater Chicago area. [47]

Marie Herdt was born on January 24, 1917 to John and Mary (Reichert) Herdt. She married Robert Schiller in 1936, and had a son, Robert, in 1938, but they divorced in 1940. After William's death in 1933, Anna moved to Baraboo. She married Verge Douglas on July 1, 1943 in Chilton, Wisconsin. Living in Baraboo, Anna was



a member of St. John's Lutheran Church the Ladies Aide Society, the Hammond Organ Club, and the Federated Club. She was also part owner of the Douglas Drapery Shop. Anna died on May 31, 1979 in Continental Manor of the Wisconsin Dells. She was buried with William H. Gall in the Rock Springs Cemetery. [49]

Mr. Douglas had been a widower for four years. He owned The Douglas Drapery Shop in Baraboo and was a member of the Methodist Church, the Baraboo Lodge of F&AM, and The Order of the Eastern Star. Robert W. Gall was born on January 14, 1924 in Ableman, Wisconsin. He was a member of Baraboo High School's Class of 1941. Bob attended the University of Wisconsin and then joined the U.S. Army in 1942. He met his wife, Yvonne Lehmann, while on tour in France in 1946. They married in 1947. Bob was reactivated for the Korean War from 1950 to 1951.

In 1966, Bob was hired by the Pennsylvania Life Insurance Company. The family moved to Indianapolis, Indiana when the company transferred him in 1967 to serve as a Co-State Manager. He and Yvonne remained in the Indianapolis area until they moved to Largo, Florida in 1981.

Robert Gall was a member of the Christ the King Lutheran Church in Largo, as well as, a lifelong member of the Columbus (Wisconsin) VFW Post 8090, a 26-year member of the American Legion Post 273 (Madeira, Florida), a 10-year member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles (Florida), and a member of the Army and Navy Union, USA from 1993 until his death. Bob and Yvonne owned and operated Gall's Restaurant in Columbus, WI from 1947 until 1951, and then owned and operated "Bob's Bar" and subsequently "The Town Tap" in Columbus until 1966. 

August Hinz was the youngest of the sons of Friedrich and Charlotte Hinz. He was born October 9, 1856 in Sagemühl, Kreis Rummelsburg, Pommern. He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran Parish at Zettin. In 1881 he underwent training in the German Army and also married Ernestine Heritz. After the birth of their first son Emil, they immigrated to the United States with members of their respective families. They left Hamburg on November 26, 1882 and sailed directly to New York aboard the SS Bohemia under the command of Captain Pezoldt. Their ship docked in the Port of New York on December 15, 1882. Traveling with August, Ernestine, and baby Emil were August's mother Charlotte Hinz, Ernestine's parents, and Julius Hinz and his family. They settled on a farm in unincorporated Freedom, Sauk County, Wisconsin where they reared their children until Ernestine's untimely death in 1897.

Nearly two years after Ernestine died August remarried with the widow, Augusta (Buelow) Trachsler. They continued family life on the farm and Augusta raised the Hinz children along with her own from her previous marriage. On October 30, 1906, August Hinz was sworn in at the Sauk County courthouse and became a citizen of the United States of

America. In 1916, after thirty-four years of tilling the soil in Freedom, the family moved to Ableman (now called Rock Springs). During his eighteen year residence in Ableman, August and Augusta were members of St. John's Lutheran Church. August served several years on the church council. August became ill about five weeks before his death on June 16, 1933. Augusta died five years later. August and Augusta are buried together in the Lutheran cemetery just north of Rock Springs. Julius and Adeline Hintz are buried in the same cemetery. [1]

Ernestine (Heritz) Hinz – wife of August R. Hinz (Generation 1)

Ernestine was the fourth child born to Henrich and Albertine Heritz. Born February 16, 1862 in Pomerania, she married August Hinz of Poberow in 1881. Together, they had seven children, with only Emil being born in Germany (Pommern). Ernestine and August lived about four miles south-west of the village of North Freedom. Here were born Adeline (1883), Richard (1885), August (1887), Anna (1889), Edward (1892), and Emma (1897) Hinz. Ernestine died on July 10th from heart failure due to complications from giving birth to Emma on June 20, 1897. She had been ill for several weeks prior to her death.[4] Emma died four months later. Mother and daughter are buried together at the Zion Lutheran Stone Church Cemetery in Westfield Township, Sauk County, Wisconsin. [2]

Augusta (Trachsler) Hinz – second wife of August R. Hinz (Generation 1)

Augusta Trachsler was the second wife of widower August Hinz. Augusta was born Augusta W. Buelow to Friedrich (Johann) and Caroline Buelow in 1860 in Germany. Augusta immigrated to the Unites States with her family around 1862. She married Swissborn Emil Trachsler around 1880, and appears in the 1880 census with Emil's family in Honey Creek, Sauk County, Wisconsin. Emil and Augusta had two daughters and three sons. After Emil died in 1898, Augusta and August Hinz were married in March of 1899. She entered the Hinz family with three of her five children; Walter (16 years old), Katherine (12), and Emil (5). Her younger daughter, Karoline, had died in 1894 at the age of five. With the six Hinz siblings, Augusta immediately became a mother to nine children. She died on September 13, 1938 at the home of her daughter Katherine (Trachsler) Meyer. Augusta was buried with August in the Rock Springs (St. John's Lutheran) Cemetery. [3]

The first child of August and Ernestine Hinz, Emil Albert Hinz was born in Germany on January 26, 1881. He was less than two years old when he and his parents immigrated to the United States. On April 5, 1905 Emil married Amanda Marie Knoop in Sauk County. Emil worked at the Sauk County Hospital and Home as a night attendant for many years. On October 15, 1946, while on duty, he was suddenly struck in the left eye by an inmate.

The blow caused Emil to fall and hit his head on the floor, which in turn caused a skull fracture. He died at the Reedsburg Hospital on Tuesday, October 22nd. The funeral for Emil was held on Thursday at the Ableman (Rock Springs) Lutheran Church with the Rev. Phillip Lehman officiating. Herman Zantow, Reuben Knoop, Edward Schwarz, and Edward, Wilbur, and Garvin Hinz were pallbearers. Emil was buried with Amanda in Oak Hill Cemetery in North Freedom.

A coroner's inquest was held on Wednesday, October 23rd, by Dr. O. V. Pawlisch, Sauk County Coroner and District Attorney Raymond J. Kasiska at the Sauk County Hospital and Home. After witnesses were called, "the jury brought in a verdict stating; Emil Hinz came to his death about 2:15 A.M. October 22,1946, as a result of skull fracture received in falling on the floor at the Sauk County Home after being struck by Peter Huerth about 10:15 PM October 15, 1946." On October 28th, it was reported in the Wisconsin State Journal that the District Attorney had issued a warrant charging Peter Huerth with fourth degree manslaughter in connection with the death of Emil Hinz. Another article appearing in the Manitowoc Herald Times on November 14, 1946 stated that a Circuit Court Judge had committed Mr. Huerth to the Central State Hospital in Wausau in relation to the manslaughter hearing. [4]

Amanda Marie Knoop – wife of Emil Albert Hinz

Amanda Marie Knoop was born on April 20, 1886 in Wisconsin to August and Henrietta Knoop. Her parents were German immigrants. Amanda married Emil Albert Hinz on April 5, 1905 and they had two daughters, Viola E. and Fern A. Hinz. Amanda died on Friday, December 28, 1934 after a brief illness following a stroke. Funeral services were held on Monday at St. John's Lutheran Church in Ableman (Rock Springs) with the Rev. Phillip Lehman officiating. She was buried in Oak Hill Cemetery in North Freedom, Wisconsin. Edward Schanke, Albin Malmquist, Arthur Meyer, Henry Rehr, Cleon Fleming, and Charles Schanke were pallbearers. [5]

Viola Esther Hinz was born on the last day of August in 1905. She married Edward Goetlib Steinhorst and they had three daughters. Viola was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and the Ladies Aid Society of the church. She died on June 21, 1976 in St. Clare Hospital, just eleven days after the passing of her sister's husband, Henry Steinhorst. Funeral services for Viola were held on Thursday June 24 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church with Rev. Emil Toepel officiating. She was buried in Oak Hill Cemetery in North Freedom. Pallbearers were Gary, Davis, and Steve Zimmerman, John Schultz, Keith Zick, and William Vertein. [6]

Edward Steinhorst - husband of Viola E Hinz

Edward Steinhorst was born on February 3, 1900 in Wisconsin to Henry and Emma (Eickert) Steinhorst. He married Viola Hinz. Edward farmed in the town of Excelsior for thirty-one years. He was also the maintenance manager for the Baraboo School System for several years. Additionally, Edward served as Superintendent of the Sauk County Fair Association for many years. He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in North Freedom where he served as the maintenance manager for twenty years. Edward died on November 30, 1985 in Sauk Prairie Memorial Hospital. June worked as a securities trader at Heronymus Investment Company in Sheboygan. On November 29, 1947 she married Walter Vollrath in St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Plymouth. They had two daughters and a son. She served as Girl Scout leader, den mother, and choir mother for her children. She helped organize the Friends of the Arts of the John Michael Kohler Arts Center. June was a member of the First Congregational Church, UCC and the Deborah Circle. She also personally presented the Walter and June Vollrath Scholarships to students at twelve Sheboygan County high schools until her death. June died on November 16, 2000. After graduation, Walter served in the US Navy from 1940 to 1946 on three destroyers: USS Forrest (DD461), USS Harding (DD625) and the USS Mugford (DD389). During his Navy career, Walter participated in the invasions of North Africa, Normandy, Southern France and Okinawa. He was released from active duty in early 1946 with the rank of Lt. Commander USNR. The Navy remained a great source of pride and Walter held it in great respect. The American flag and all it stood for was of utmost importance to him and he flew a flag daily at both his residences.

Walter was married on November 29, 1947 to June Longrie of Plymouth, Wisconsin and they had three children. Walter belonged to the Masons, the Elks and the Sheboygan Yacht Club. He supported numerous local charities such as the John Michael Kohler Arts Center, the Red Cross, the YMCA, the Boy Scouts, the University of Wisconsin, the Stefanie H. Weill Center for the Performing Arts, Camp Y-Koda, the Bookworm Gardens, and the Wisconsin Maritime Museum. Walter established the Walter and June Vollrath Fund which awards a scholarship to a graduate from every Sheboygan County high school with two recipients from North and South High School. It has provided scholarships to over 210 students through the years.

Walter loved hunting and fishing and took many trips to northern Wisconsin, Minnesota, Mexico, Alaska, and Canada with his lifelong friends. These trips resulted in many humorous stories which he loved to share to the delight of family and friends. His passions in life were the US Navy, flying and the Wisconsin Badger athletic teams, with the football team holding a special place in his heart. One of his favorite places was in the skies in his own plane going anywhere. He used his plane for pleasure and business completing countless trips to the plant in Searcy, Arkansas. During his flying career he covered most of North America touching base from Alaska to Baja. Walter spent every one of his summers at Elkhart Lake. He loved being at the cottage and could be found almost every morning and evening taking his swim. He loved not only the lake but the camaraderie with family and friends who walked the path or swam or boated past his cottage and pier. He was always ready with a smile and a chat. His favorite place to watch the sunset was a December evening, at his cottage while the sun set over the outlet. His love of Elkhart Lake is

evidenced by his gift to the community of the June Vollrath Park and his help in the reconstruction of the tennis courts. Walter died on August 16, 2006. [42]

An article appearing in the Reedsburg Times Press on September 1, 1994 quoted Ella as saying, "The two biggest changes in the last one hundred years; electricity and cars." Her 100th birthday was also announced on national television's "The Today Show."

Ella died on December 19, 1995 at the nursing home in Reedsburg. She was age one hundred and one years old. Funeral services were held on Friday, December 22, 1995 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Rock Springs with the Rev. Paul Schroeder officiating. Ella was buried with her husband in Oak Hill Cemetery in North Freedom. [44]
