Preface

Belgium

Historically, Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg were known as the Low Countries, which used to cover a somewhat larger area than the current Benelux group of states. The region was called Belgica in Latin because of the Roman province Gallia Belgica which covered more or less the same area. From the end of the Middle Ages until the 17th century, it was a prosperous centre of commerce and culture. From the 16th century until the Belgian Revolution in 1830, when Belgium seceded from the Netherlands, many battles between European powers were fought in the area of Belgium, causing it to be dubbed the "cockfighting arena of Europe," a reputation strengthened by both World Wars.

Upon its independence, Belgium participated in the Industrial Revolution and, during the course of the 20th century, possessed a number of colonies in Africa. The second half of the 20th century was marked by the rise of contrasts between the Flemish (located primarily in the northern half of the country) and the Francophones (southern half) fueled by differences of language and the unequal economic development of Flanders and Wallonia.

Wauchope, Saskatchewan



Wauchope (pronounced "walk-up") is a small hamlet in the southeast corner of the Canadian province of Saskatchewan. It is located between the towns of Manor and Redvers,

Aristide Adolphe Huybrecht was born to Adolf and Louise (Destombes) Huybrecht on September 14, 1868. He was eleven years old when his father died in 1879. Aristide and Clotilde Lievigne Buisine were married on August 31, 1895. After immigrating to Canada in 1897, they had several children who became the ancestors of the families contained within these pages. They appeared in the 1901 Canadian Census living in Sifton, Manitoba. The family lived, according to the records, with Aristide's younger brother Eugene who had come to Canada before them in 1890. The census records also show that Aristide could speak both French and English, as well as read and write, but that Clotilde could speak only French. It doesn't state that she could read or write. Around 1907 the family moved to the community of Wauchope, Saskatchewan which had been founded in 1901. They lived with the Quennelle family until their house could be built. It was in Wauchope where the rest of the Huybrecht children were born. Aristide was an influential man in the town, serving as mayor for many years. He also ran a farm implement store where he sold Massey, Harris and Cockshutt machinery. He also had fuel pumps for a while. The girls attended school at the nearby Saint Anne Convent. Aristide died in Wauchope, Saskatchewan on January 5, 1937. [6]

Clotilde Lievigne Buisine - wife of Aristide Huybrecht

Clotilde Lievigne Buisine was born on February 11, 1870 in France. She married Aristide Huybrecht on August 31, 1895 and had eleven children. Clotilde had a physical problem that caused most of her babies to be born prematurely. Of the eleven children

Marie Louise Huybrecht was born in France on August 10, 1896, immigrating to Canada with her parents as an infant. She married John Earl Burrell on November 2, 1918 in St. Mary's Pro-Cathedral in Winnipeg, Manitoba. In 1923 she and John and their infant daughter, Isabel, immigrated to the United States, settling in the Detroit, Michigan area. After her husband John died in 1960, Marie lived with her daughter, Isabel. Marie died in Livonia, Michigan on January 26, 1993 and was buried with John Earl at Holy Sepulchre Catholic Cemetery. [1]

John Earl Burrell – husband of Marie Louise Huybrecht

John Earl Burrell was born on May 16, 1865 in Walkerton, Ontario, Canada. John Earl appears in the Winnipeg City Directories as proprietor and/or manager of the City Auto and Taxi Company starting in 1918. Those entries ended in 1923 when he, his wife and daughter immigrated to Detroit, Michigan. In Detroit John Earl worked as a bus driver. He died on April 30, 1960 in the Detroit, Michigan area and was buried at Holy Sepulchre Catholic Cemetery near Southfield, Michigan. [2]

Marguerite Marie Huybrecht was born in Grande-Clairiere, Manitoba on December 7, 1899. She was married in December of 1920 in Wauchope, Saskatchewan. She followed her husband to many Canadian Pacific Railway stations, the last being in Keewatin, Ontario. They retired in LaSalle, Manitoba and traveled south to California during the winter months. They spent many summers at their cottages, first in St. Lauren, and later at Blindfold Lake, Ontario.

On October 3, 1970, Marguerite and Gabriel celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary in LaSalle, Manitoba. There was an afternoon mass at which they renewed their vows. Monsignor Lapointe officiated, assisted by Rene and Guy Bernuy as altar boys. Francis Bernuy was the lector and Antoinette Heybrecht, Emile Bernuy, and Mr. and Mrs. George Bernuy carried the offerings. Gilbert Cormier rendered appropriate solos accompanied by Mrs. Raymond Rochon at the organ.

Following the ceremony, Mr. and Mrs. Bernuy were host to fifty relatives and friends at a dinner in the parish hall. Gaston Rochon acted as master of ceremonies and Emile Bernuy delivered the toast. Gold predominated in the decorations and a beautiful cake centered the head table. At the evening reception dancing and refreshments were enjoyed by some 150 people. Lloyd Magarell, Reeve of the municipality, made the presentation and messages were read from Gov. General Michener, Lt. Gov. McKeag, Prime Minister Trudeau, Premier Schreyer and others.

Marguerite died peacefully at the Fort Garry Care Centre on January 11, 2000. She was one-hundred years old. She lived her last years in her home in LaSalle, Manitoba, where she celebrated her 100th birthday with many relatives and friends from France, the United States, and Canada. A funeral mass was held at the Ste. Hyacinthe Roman Catholic Church in LaSalle on Monday, January 17. Her remains were cremated and interred in Wauchope, Saskatchewan. [1]

Gabriel Eugene Bernuy – husband of Marguerite Marie Huybrecht

Gabriel Eugene Bernuy was born on May 6, 1898 in Belley Aine, France to Francois and Josephine (Guignet) Bernuy. He grew up in Wauchope and, like his father, worked for the Canadian Pacific Railway. Gabriel left the railway in October of 1916 to join the Canadian Signalers in World War I. He took part in several battles and received the Military Medal for his work in the war. George Clayton Stemen was born on November 23, 1909 to Clayton D. and Dora (Hil-dreth) Stemen in Lima, Ohio. He married Jeanne Marie Huybrecht in Waterloo, Michigan on December 8, 1932. Living in Toledo, Ohio, George was a founder of the Glass City Motorcycle Club. He worked for, and retired from, the Dana Corporation. George died on Monday, May 8, 1995 in the Toledo Hospital. A funeral mass was held on Wednesday in the Resurrection of Our Lord Church in Ottawa, Ontario. Her remains were cremated and interred in St. Regis Cemetery in Wauchope, Saskatchewan. [1]
